SAN FRANCISCO.—The Wells Fargo Express Company has filed an answer to the suit recently entered to compel the company to bear the expense of all war stamps on packages transmitted. In the answer Wells Fargo & company contend that a decision compelling the company to bear the cost of stamps for each and every package forwarded would mean a dead loss to the company of \$510 a day or \$160,000 a year at least.
