Ranges of Arizona Offer Promising Inducements

Copper mining is now more profitable than gold mining, and the great advance in the price of copper which has taken place during the last year is likely to be permanent, because it was not brought about by speculation but it is due to an increased demand for the metal which came in with the application of electricity to so many of the daily uses of life, and since the use of that element is to be permanent, and the ends to which it may be applied are likely to be greatly increased, the chances are all in favor of the price of copper becoming still higher, rather than lower.

The mountains in Arizona are full of indications of copper, and the prospectors of this territory could not turn their attention on a more promising direction than to undertake a systematic search for this metal. Twenty years ago, when the mountains were full of men prospecting for silver, many promising copper leads were found, and though the most of them would not pay for working at the prices then prevailing it is probable that a great many of them could be made good properties at the price which the metal now commands.

It will be well worth while for the miners of the territory to give their attention to this matter. There is money in copper, and the best feature of the situation is the fact that it is a coming metal.

On three year contracts primary and grammar grade teachers are offered \$75 to \$100 per month, and superintendents \$2,000 to \$2,500 per year. In addition to salaries all expenses to Manila are to be paid.
