### NEW REGULATIONS AT REFORM SCHOOL

Governor George W. P. Hunt is planning for the assignment by the government of Lieutenant Jewett of the regular army as military instructor at the industrial school at Benson. The governor believes military drill will be of much benefit to

the inmates. A set of brass band instruments, 18 in number, has been ordered for the use of the school and a young musician, who is serving a term in the penitentiary for a minor offense, will be sent to the school as instructor of the band.

Dunnegan and Arnold were riding in a race which was a feature of a picnic in the Animas valley.
