PRESERVE THE TIMBER.

There is nothing new in the following item, but it is one that ought to be printed in every newspaper in the United States, and in the timber regions it ought to be printed in great letters and posted on every dead wall, that every man might read and appreciate it. Professor Runnebaum, of Berlin, sent by the German government to examine the timber resources of our Pacific coast, expressed amazement at the waste he witnessed there. He says that the end of American forests is near at hand unless they are protected by law against reckless cutting and conflagrations.

While the leading countries of Europe are trying to make trees grow, the Americans are sweeping away not only the mature trees, but the saplings, which are the rightful heritage of future generations. "If nothing is done by your government," in his opinion, "you may live to see lumber shipped from Germany to Puget Sound." When the Professor was in Oregon and Washington, the whole coast was darkened with smoke from fires devouring enormous tracts of timber, unsurpassed in the world. His remark that the life of the forest is the life of the people is no flourish of rhetoric. It is a verified law of nature, but trifled with or ignored as yet in America.—S. L. Tribune.

LAST Saturday the Union and Irrigation Canal company was cited to appear in the justice's court at Solomonville on a criminal charge of obstructing the public highway, on a complaint sworn to by Pedro Michelena. Where it is alleged that the company has obstructed the road is where the canal crosses the county road just north of Solomonville and at the head of the canal. The present head is where it was originally located, but in 1890 another head was constructed about a mile below, but that proving unsatisfactory, the canal was rebuilt back to the old head. After the canal was finished a good bridge was constructed across the ditch and in the county road. Representatives of the company had the road overseer of that district view the bridge and asked him to receive it as a county charge. The overseer said the bridge was all right but that he did not have the power to receive it, and that as soon as the supervisors met he would get them to view and receive it. The board, however, has nothing to do with receiving such work and did not do it, but this the company did not know and thought it was all right, which it would have been had the road overseer known it to be his duty to receive it. When the floods came last summer the bridge was washed away, but the company thinking it to be county property, and which, properly speaking does belong to the county, did not have it rebuilt as they did not consider it their duty to do so. The company propose fighting it out as they consider themselves not the responsible parties.

In a recent speech Governor Bois, of Iowa, said: "We did not wait for an international agreement to demonetize silver; we acted alone, independent of any other nation, when we shut it out from our mints, and so did every other country that did the same thing. If it is ever restored it will be done in the same way."

THE administration has taken another step in its apparent intention of playing the commercial and financial interests of this country into the hands of Great Britain. By ceasing the coinage of standard silver dollars at most of the mints the administration deals another blow at the wealth of this country, gives silver another set-back in the process of recuperation under the maladministration of congress and the treasury, and appreciates the value of gold, thereby increasing the demand for it and increasing also the liability of the government to gold drafts. Paramountly, also, the stopping of silver dollar coinage will allow the owners of gold in Europe to get more in exchange for their gold than they are able to obtain now, although this exchange value already is abnormal. In all soberness we say that administration and governments have been impeached and damned morally for all time for the commission of less foul offenses against the masses of the people than this administration has been guilty of repeatedly.—Syracuse Herald.

THEODORE DURRANT was convicted of murder in the first degree without any recommendation for mercy. The jury was out only 20 minutes and when the verdict of the grand jury was read Mrs. Durrant became hysterical and Theodore Durrant's face became ghastly pale, and he attempted to rise to his feet. His excitement was but momentary, and he regained his accustomed composure. Never in the history of a California court has there been such extreme excitement as was manifested when the decision was rendered that was to end the career of Durrant. Men cheered and women wept and became hysterical. The general opinion is that the verdict was a just one.

DISTRICT ATTORNEY JONES received a telegram on Wednesday stating that his brother, Alex. J. Jones, who was a candidate for Drainage Trustee in Chicago on the Democratic ticket was elected last Tuesday by a plurality vote of over 3,000. The office to which Mr. Jones has been elected is one of great responsibility and pays \$3,000 per year.
