CAPTURED IN TUCSON

Alfredo Ortiz Who Slashed Gid Thompson Again in Custody

Alfredo Ortiz, the Mexican who made his escape from custody while suffering from three bullet wounds and who was confined to his home awaiting an improvement in his condition which would permit his removal to the county jail on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon upon a peace officer, was captured in Tucson on Wednesday and was landed in jail in Clifton on Friday evening. The assault for which Ortiz was arrested occurred about six weeks ago in the La Favorita saloon on Chase Creek. Ortiz was creating trouble in the saloon and Night Officer Gid Thompson was summoned. While in the act of making the arrest Ortiz slashed the officer with a knife across the shoulder. Thompson then shot Ortiz three times who escaped but was later arrested at his house where he crawled under the bed. He was in a serious condition and upon the advice of the doctor was not removed to the county jail. About three weeks later Ortiz arose from his bed, when he was not being watched, and made his escape. He was discovered in Tucson by an acquaintance from Clifton and was placed under arrest by the Pima County Sheriff.

Deputy Keppeler went to Tucson Wednesday morning and returned with the prisoner Friday. Ortiz stated from his house disguised in woman's clothing and remained five days on Shannon hill and then rode in a wagon to Solomonville and made his way to Bowie where he was arrested for a vag and locked up for seven days. When he was released he made his way to Tucson where he was recognized and apprehended.—Era.
