tion. Wilford had not been vaccinated. This was also verified by the certificate of death of the two physicians attending.

"From conversations with at least a dozen men we learned that there was no sickness in camp, except as outlined above; only a few individual cases of homesickness. The only thing that seemed to be worrying the boys, is not knowing what is in store for them. Shoes seem to be the only trouble, on account of long walks and drills in the hot, sandy country, and having only light shoes, in some cases, makes it hard on their feet. Other than this, there seemed to be nothing lacking. We were treated with the greatest courtesy.

"Warren Smith gave a detailed description of things as they are going on there and wanted me to convey the best wishes of the Company to the bereaved family.

"I have given what I consider a correct report, in as brief a manner as I could possibly do it, and this report is not intended to lessen or encourage conditions as I found them there."

Mr. Claydon's report was followed by an address by Bishop James R. Welker, who spoke of

the good qualities and traits of the deceased.




