FEDERAL ROAD FUNDS "Next year's Federal aid road funds, amounting to a maximum of \$42,500 for New Mexico and \$59,600 for Arizona will shortly be allotted by the Secretary of Agriculture for the construction of roads in and near the National Forests, provided the local authorities make acceptable offers of cooperation." The above statement was issued at Albuquerque by the District Forester, who also stated that the several county and state officers had been reminded that application for Federal aid road funds for the fiscal year, beginning July 1, 1918, are due January 1st.

Ordinarily an application for Federal assistance should assure the appropriation, by the county or state authorities, of one-half the estimated cost of the road. Most of the applications so far received from the Southwest, and all of the projects so far recommended by the District Forester for the Secretary of Agriculture's approval, are said to have been on the "fifty-fifty" basis.

The Federal Aid Road Act, which became effective last July, makes possible the allotment of over a million dollars for roads in Arizona and New Mexico during the next ten years. This sum, as explained by officials of the Forest Service, is in addition to the percentage of National Forest receipts already accruing to the Forest counties for roads and schools.
