The forest, school and road apportionment for the year 1919, amounting to \$3,280.48, having been received by the county treasurer from the office of the State auditor, was, by motion, duly put and carried, apportioned by the Board of Supervisors, as follows:

Three Thousand Dollars to the general road fund, and \$280.48 to the school fund.

The board, by motion, duly put and carried, ordered the county treasurer to make transfer of county funds, as follows:

Nine Thousand Dollars from the general road fund to road district funds, as follows:

Three Thousand Dollars to road district No. 1 fund; \$3,000.00 to road district No. 2 fund; \$3,000.00 to road district No. 3 fund.

Nine Hundred Twenty-nine and 26/100 from the general road fund to road district No. 3 fund, and from the general road fund, \$106.90 to road district No. 1 fund.

One Hundred Six and 90/100 from road district No. 1 fund to general county road fund, and

\$929.26 from road district No. 3 fund to general county road fund.

The board, by motion, duly put and carried, authorized the clerk to affect an agreement with John W. Morris for the rental of the county poor farm, consisting of six acres, more or less, situated in Safford, Arizona, for the sum of \$150.00, for the season of 1920. Said John W. Morris to furnish a note for the above mentioned sum, duly executed by him and payable the 1st day of June, 1920.

J. D. Halstead Lumber Company, having furnished the lumber for the flooring of the Pima bridge, as stated in their contract of October 6, 1919, with Graham county, the board, by motion duly put and carried, accepted the same and thereupon declared the contract fulfilled, as per agreement and provisions of the same, and thereupon instructed the clerk of the board to return to the J. D. Halstead Lumber Company, their certified check for the sum of \$111.35, which accompanied their bid heretofore mentioned to insure the fulfilling of said contract.

The board having no further business to transact at this meeting, by motion, duly put and carried, adjourned sine die.

Poison Weed Kills Cattle in Arizona

Cattlemen of Cochise county are complaining of heavy losses in their herds, due to the cows eating a poison weed which resembles considerably the rattle weed, or peavine. J. N. Hunsacker, whose range is in Leslie canyon, complains of such loss and for that reason has moved his herd from the upper canyon in the forest reserve, where the poisonous plant seems to grow profusely.

He found several cattle which had died, while others, which probably had not eaten such quantities of the weed, showed the effect by staggering as they walked.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we W. R. CHAMBERS, whose residence and post office address is Safford, Arizona, WILLIAM McRAE, whose residence and post office address is Thatcher, Arizona, W. W. PAGE, whose residence and post office address is Thatcher, Arizona, FRANK A. WEBSTER, whose residence and post office address is Central, Arizona, and J. W. MATTICE, whose residence and post office address is Pima, Arizona, and all being citizens of the United States, and of the State of Arizona, have this day associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Arizona, and to make, sign, acknowledge, publish and adopt the following as the articles of incorporation thereof.

ARTICLE I.

The names of the incorporators are W. R. CHAMBERS, WILLIAM McRAE, W. W. PAGE, FRANK A. WEBSTER, and J. W. MATTICE. The name of the corporation is ARIZONA TRUST AND SAVINGS BANK. The principal place for the transaction of business is the Town of Safford, County of Graham, State of Arizona, and branch offices and banks may be established by the directors at Thatcher, Arizona, and at such other places within the State of Arizona as they may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE II.

The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation and the object for which it is formed are for the purpose of banking in all its branches, by receiving deposits and paying them out again upon the order of depositors, buying and selling exchange, coin and bullion, borrowing and lending money, loaning, buying, selling, discounting, holding and dealing with and in all kinds of commercial paper, including promissory notes, mortgages on real and personal property, stocks, bonds, city, town, school, county and state warrants, and all evidences of debt and bankable paper on good and sufficient security, either personal, collateral, or real estate to be determined by the officers of the bank.
