REPORT OF CONDITION OF HIGHWAYS IN STATE

Under date of December 22d, the automobile club of Arizona has issued a bulletin, showing the condition of the roads in different sections of the state.

The bulletin reports the fall of rain and snow in the northern part of the state, but all main highways are now passable and in fair condition. All roads in the central and southern parts are dry and in many places have been dragged. All ferries on the Colorado river are in operation, and all ferds on other rivers are passable.

Northern Part of State

The road from Springerville to St. Johns is good. St. Johns to Holbrook good. A detour is necessary near Holbrook, where work is in progress. Springerville to New Mexico, fair to good.

Central Part of State

Roads in central part fair to good, though chunky in places. Mesa to Florence fair, chunky in places. Florence to Tucson fair to good, short rough detours on account of construction work. Mesa to Roosevelt Dam via Apache Trail, road nearly completed, but there are about five miles of uncompleted road. Mesa to Superior mostly good. Superior to Ray fair. Superior to Miami good, Miami to Globe paved. Globe to Rice excellent. Rice to Springerville closed on account of snow. Rice to Geronimo, rough. Geronimo to Glenbar good. Glenbar to Safford, chunky. Safford to Clifton fair. Clifton to Duncan fair. Safford to Duncan good. Safford to Bowie rough. Duncan to Lordsburg fair.

Southern Part of State

All roads in southern part of state in fair to good condition with short rough detours on account of construction work.
