ISSUES ORDER.

Major General Hailey Issues Order No. 14 in Regard to Coming Reunion.

Headquarters Oklahoma Division U. C. V.
Adjutant General's Office
May 3, '13.

To all brigade commanders and camp commanders of all brigades and camps in the Oklahoma division, United Confederate Veterans.

Your commander is gratified to be able to advise you that the railroads of the Southwestern Passenger association have made the rate of one cent per mile each way to the reunion at Chattanooga, Tenn., May 27, 28 and 29, 1913.

Our organization is under lasting obligations to Col. A. P. Watson, Gen. John Threadgill and Col. R. B. Coleman for their untiring efforts in our behalf in successfully securing this rate. It was only after unceasing labors that your committee were able to announce that the railroads had finally agreed to make this rate.

There will be a special train over the Rock Island railroad to Memphis, leaving this state on May 25th, arriving at Memphis on the following morning, where it will be switched to the Southern railroad and later to the Nashville, St. Louis & Chattanooga, arriving at Chattanooga about four p. m., on the afternoon of May 26th. This will give ample time for the veterans to get located before the commencement of the reunion on the morning of May 27th. Comrades may call on their local railroad agents for full information as to rates, accommodations, stop-overs and such other information as may be desired. On account of the very low rate that has been secured it is desirable that as many of the veterans as possible shall arrange to attend this reunion making if possible the largest we have ever had from this state at any reunion. The special train leaving McAlester on the afternoon of May 25th will have on board the division sponsor, maids of honor and chaperons of the Choctaw brigade, First and Second brigades, Chicksaw and Creek brigades and many distinguished Confederate veterans, daughters and sons of veterans.
