THE REV. STRINGER IS SAFE

Bishop of Selkirk Forced to Eat His Moccasins in Yukon Wilds.

Dawson, Yukon, Dec. 28.—After being practically given up by his friends as lost the Right Rev. L. O. Stringer of the Church of England, Bishop of Selkirk, has returned from Fort MacPherson at the mouth of the Mackenzie river. With Charles F. Johnson, a missionary, he left the fort September 1.

During the trip the two men had to walk through a fog and storm and bitter cold for 25 days. Their scanty food gave out and just before they found friendly Indians they were compelled to eat their moccasins.

Each man lost 50 pounds in weight.

CHICAGO TROLLEYS MERGE

Combination of Surface Lines Involving \$70,000,000

Chicago, Dec. 28.—A 35-mile ride for five cents will be made possible by the \$70,000,000 merger of all the surface railway lines of the south side. According to figures given out by President Thomas E. Mitten of the Chicago City Railways the average number of passengers carried annually on the lines involved in the railway merger is 340,000,000. Of this number it is estimated that 220,000,000 are cash fares and the remainder transfers. The various roads involved in the merger cover 407 miles of railways.

TO SUCCEED JUSTICE FITTS

Randall J. LeBoeuf of Albany Appointed by Gov. Hughes.

Albany, Dec. 28.—Governor Hughes has appointed Randall J. LeBoeuf of Albany, a Republican, as supreme court justice of the third judicial district, to succeed the late Justice George H. Fitts of Cohoes. Judge LeBoeuf was born in Cohoes in 1870 and was graduated from Cornell university in 1892. He later practiced law with Carter, Hughes & Kellogg of New York, a firm of which Governor Hughes was a member. Mr. LeBoeuf removed to Albany in 1895 and has resided here since.

STATE ROAD PROMISED

Fine Road Between Adams and Pittsfield Now Assured.

North Adams, Dec. 28.—Last spring the county commissioners and some business men went to Boston for the purpose of trying to obtain a section of state road through Berkshire and Berkshire. A few weeks ago C. Z. Dean of Berkshire and George B. Adams of Adams went to Boston again and have now been informed that the state road desired will be built during the coming year.

THIRTEEN MAY HAVE DROWNED

Five-Masted Schooner, Davis Palmer Believed to Be Lost.

Boston, Dec. 28.—Masses of wreckage apparently from the five-masted schooner Davis Palmer of Boston were found on the beach at Hull yesterday, and it is believed the vessel struck one of the outer ledges in the harbor during the storm and went to pieces with the loss of all on board, a total of 12 men.
