FIGHTING WITH NO LET UP IN WEST OF FRANCE

Germans Have Pushed Back Line of Allied Armies
NEW ADVANCE BY ALLIES

Paris Asserts that Move to Turn the Right of von Kluck's Army is Succeeding

London, Oct. 5.—There has been no letup in the fighting in western France. The Germans have continued their attacks and have compelled the allies to give ground at several points.

Military experts here, however, assert that there has been no change of situation on the right of the allied armies.

Paris, Oct. 4.—General Joffre sends news tonight that spurs optimism. The flags of France and England were carried forward at the west and east of the line despite desperate efforts of the Germans to mend their failing fortunes.

The Allies resumed the movement to envelop von Kluck, started the German trenches north of Soissons and accelerated the retreat of Crown Prince Frederick William.

Reserved, cautious and generalized the government reports today contain nevertheless a new note of satisfaction. The rise to destroy von Kluck's supply line, and roll his army back upon von Buelow's is again under headway north and east of Arras, which the fighting, tremendously violent, was indecisive today. There are reports that flying columns have circled toward the Belgium frontier.

The details of a new advance by the Allies were emphasized by the government report tonight which was issued at 11 o'clock. The text was: "First—On our left wing the struggle is at its height in the Arras district without yet having had a decisive result. The action has been less violent between the upper valley of the Encre and the Somme and between the Somme and the Oise. We have progressed in the Soissons district where the enemy's trenches have been taken.

Second—On almost all the rest of the front the calm already noted continues. In the Woeve district we have made some progress between Apremont and the Meuse and on the Rupt de Mad."

Probably the most important success of the twenty-second day of the battle was gained near Soissons by breaching the west end of the Germans' long fortified and almost impregnable position reaching from the Aisne to the Sulpice. Hitherto the Germans have frustrated all such attacks. Eastward to the Argonne ridge the combatants, both behind unbreakable fortifications, did not risk frontal attacks. Battle raged in the forests of the Argonne, mistletoe crown at the heel of the German Crown Prince. His efforts to cooperate with the Bavarians and von Lering in assaulting the barrier fortresses were defeated yesterday. Today he was energetically pursued as he fled northward. His repulse necessarily weakens the whole German line.

Guerrilla warfare continues in Lorraine and the Vosges, where Germans and French, holding strong positions, thrust at each other in day and night raids, neither side able to progress despite small but most sanguinary engagements. This fighting, which would compel attention at another time, is lost sight of in the vast and dramatic combat at the west.
