GERMAN REPRISAL

London Expects it For Alleged Cruelty of British.

London, Jan. 6.—The belief is expressed in official circles here that the next step in the Baralong controversy will be a reprisal by Germany which is expected to take the form of the shooting of a number of English officers and men prisoners equalling the number of German submarine officers and men lost when the submarine was sunk by the Baralong.

There is little hope expressed that Germany will meet Sir Edward Grey's suggestion for a neutral naval board to consider the Baralong case in conjunction with the charges made against German submarines. It is stated that if the controversy is carried further Great Britain very likely will take the stand that the affidavits of the multitudes provides insufficient and unreliable evidence concerning the charges made.
