

Next Tuesday all the voters of Vermont of the three leading parties have the opportunity to go to the polls at their regular voting places and express their choice as to who they want for presidential candidates. Every voter should go and if he fails he should not grumble afterward about the result. It is the first time in history that Vermont voters have had this privilege. The polls will be open from noon until 8 o'clock in the evening so that all may have a chance to vote.

"So far as the primary vote is concerned in selecting presidential candidates it has worked out a perfect farce. Those who have wanted a primary law must be well pleased," says the Waterbury Record which must be looking for a scrap with the Bennington Banner.—Montpelier Argus.

When an individual or a newspaper is so zigzagged, prejudiced and unfair that it does not hesitate to condemn and vilify something that it has never seen and does not understand, it is a waste of time to argue. THE "WEST END" ROAD

Contract Let to J. H. McCusker of Waltham, Mass.

J. H. McCusker of Waltham, Mass., who built the Harwood hill road and other highways for Mr. Colgate is to put in the new road from Anthony crossing to the New York line. The contracts have been signed and will be delivered in a few days. Mr. McCusker was here last Friday and went over the road with Mr. Davis, the county road commissioner. Work is to be begun this week and Mr. McCusker is now looking for men. A drill has been set up to take out the ledge in front of the Phil. Jacob's place and work has begun there.

The state has agreed to contribute \$3500. The town voted \$2500 at the last March meeting. The selectmen have agreed to put on \$500 of the so-called five per cent money coming from the state and \$3500 has been pledged by private subscription. Mr. Colgate has agreed to pay the cost in excess of \$10,000 and has already spent about \$2200 on the road. About \$2500 of the private pledges has been paid and those who subscribed are urgently requested to send in these contributions without delay because it is desired that the full amount be paid before the town delivers its contract.

The road is to be built with a strong base of the telford type with crushed stone dressing and bituminous binder.

MILITIA TO GUARD BORDER

National Guard of Three States Ordered Out for Service.

Washington, May 9.—President Wilson has consented to the ordering out of the national guards of Texas, Arizona and New Mexico for guard duty on the border. Four regiments of infantry regulars have also been ordered to entrain for the southwest.
