MURDER RING BROKEN UP Chicago Police Round Up Black Hand Bandits. Chicago, Nov. 25.—The strongest murder ring that ever operated in Chicago was broken up by the police when they rounded up the Cardinella-Campioni gang, Black Hand bandits who dominated the South Side underworld. Tonight seven members of the gang had confessed to five murders, Twelve killings, 150 robberies, 250 burglaries and scores of shootings are charged against the sixteen men held incommunicado by the police. PRINTERS GOING BACK New York Book and Job Compositors at Work Again. New York, Nov. 24.—Book and job compositors who were described by Leon H. Rouse, president of the "Big Six" typographical union as "loyal international unionists," bowed today to a mandate from the executive committee of the International Typographical union and ended the eight weeks "vacation" which has contributed largely to the general printing tie-up in this city. Just how many of the "vacationists" actually returned could not be ascertained. About 2,250 out of a total of 3,000 who attended a meeting of the union last night voted in favor of accepting the mandate, however.
