London, July 28.—Although the Germans are using very strong recinforcements of men and guns, they have not yet succeeed in breaking the Russian resistance either around Warsaw or in Kovno and Courtland proinces, in each of which sections there has been

Except for the capture of the village of Goworowo, on the Narew front, and a number of prisoners and machine guns at that point and between Mitau and the Niemen, the German official report today does not claim any advance.

General von Buelow, in the north, and Field Marshal von Hindenburg, who crossed the Narew at some points, have been checked by Russian counter-attacks.
