Supervisors Proceedings.

The board of supervisors of Platte County Nebraska, met in regular session at 2 o'clock P. M. and were called to order by County Clerk.

Moved by Supr. Schure that supervisor Swanson be chosen as temporary chairman of this board. Motion carried.

Moved by Supr. Goetz that the chair appoint a committee of three on credentials. Motion carried and chairman Swanson appointed as such committee, supervisors, G. Goetz, H. Hold and J. F. Schure.

The following was read and referred to the committee on credentials:
To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Platte County, Nebraska,
Gentlemen: I, John Ratterman, do hereby certify, that I am duly elected, qualified, and acting county judge, of the county of Platte County, Nebraska, and as such judge, I am the legal custodian of the files and records of the said county court. I further certify, that the following, to-wit: A. E. Priest of Monroe township, J. F. Schure of Burrows township and William J. Newman of Columbus township have each filed their official bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars with good and sufficient sureties thereon, and that said bonds have been approved by me and have been recorded in the records of my office. That each of the aforesaid gentlemen have taken the official oath, and are qualified to sit as members of your honorable body. Witness my hand and official seal this 24th day of January, A. D. 1906.

Hill called for vote on amendment.

Supervisors, Newman and Priest voting "Yes"; 2 Supervisors, Clother, Goetz, Held, Schure and chairman Swanson voting "No"; 5. Amendment declared lost. Hill called for vote on original motion.

Supervisors, Clother, Goetz, Held, Schure and chairman Swanson voting "Yes"; 5. Supervisors, Newman and Priest voting "No"; 2. Original motion declared carried.

Mr. F. H. Abbott, Editor of the Columbus Journal and in his address to the board stated, that on the strength of the large circulation the Columbus Journal has in the county said paper should have been named as one of the official papers and that the board of supervisors ought to reconsider their action, but if the board should not be inclined to reconsider their action in this matter, the clerk of this board be permitted to furnish to the Columbus Journal a copy of the proceedings of the board at the same time, and to furnish a copy to the official papers. On motion of Supervisor Hold the request was granted.

The petition of Hon. J. G. Rosler and 60 others, relative to lighting the court room and the several offices in the court house by means of electric light was adopted.

The committee on roads and bridges to whom was referred the matter of financing plan and specifications for the building of bridges in Platte County, Nebraska, for the year 1906, reported as follows:
That we present herewith to this board plans and specifications for their adoption for the building of county bridges for the ensuing year and we respectfully recommend that the county clerk be instructed to advertise for bids in accordance with said plans and specifications, bids to be per lineal foot.

We also recommend that all bidders be requested to specify the time required by them for the completion of said bridges. This applies to all bridges ordered within one year from date of contract and we further recommend that all of the old bridge material be taken out and placed upon the bank of the stream over which the bridge is to be constructed.

We further recommend that the successful bidder be required to give bond in the sum of \$1000.00 for the faithful performance of erecting, building, completing and completing all bridges that may be ordered by said county.

We also recommend that the county board reserves the right to reject any or all bids and that all bids be filed with the county clerk on or before noon, March 3, 1906.

Farmers' Institute for Columbus.

Carl Rohde this week handed the Journal a communication from the University authorities which shows that an excellent Farmers' Institute program has been arranged for Columbus for February 26 and 27.

Dear Sir:
We have set the dates for your Farmers' Institute for Monday and Tuesday, February 26 and 27, with afternoon and evening sessions the first day and morning and afternoon sessions the second day.

The speakers for the first day are Mr. T. G. Ferguson of Beaver Crossing, and Miss Rosa Bouton, Director of the School of Domestic Science of the University. Miss Bouton will speak in the afternoon on "Chemistry in the Kitchen," and in the evening on "Domestic Science and the Home." Mr. Ferguson will speak in the afternoon on "Alfalfa and Tens Grasses" and in the evening on "Essentials of Successful Farming in Nebraska."

The speakers for the second day are Mr. E. G. W. A. Poynter and Mr. W. D. McKee, both of Lincoln. Both are very strong men. Mr. Poynter will speak in the morning on "The Hand Separator" and in the afternoon on "The Care and Development of the Dairy Cow." Mr. McKee will speak in the morning on "The Type of the Feeder Steer" and in the afternoon on the "Breeding of Beef Cattle."

All four of these persons are very strong Institute speakers and each can discuss a variety of subjects. I have billed them for the subjects that I thought would be most valuable to your people, knowing your country as very well and the manner in which these speakers handle the subjects.
