John W. Reed.

In last issue we mentioned the serious illness of John W. Reed, and now we are called upon to record his death, which occurred at his home on Jacksons river, on Tuesday evening, at 6 o'clock. Mr. Reed's death did not come as a shock to his family and intimate friends, for he had been in declining health for a long time and lately the seriousness of his condition had forced itself upon them, and they realized that he could not recover.

For many years Mr. Reed was an active merchant at the place where he resided, and from his labor in this direction, he reaped what is considered in this country a snug fortune. In conducting his business, every detail of which he managed himself, he had fixed rules from which he never varied and to their adherence was due his remarkable success, where many have failed.

He was a native of Augusta county, but had been living in Highland since about the year 1868.

He leaves a wife and one daughter, and two sisters. Mrs. O. T. Wiley, who lives at Warm Springs, and Mrs. Dan Fisher, of Spring Hill Augusta county.

His remains were interred in the home burying ground on Thursday morning at 11 o'clock. He was a about 62 years old.
