FINANCE AND COMMERCE

New York Stock Market.
NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—The stock market enjoyed a belated rally to-day under the stimulus of covering of shorts by both local and foreign dealers. Moderate purchases for long accounts were also noted. The contributory causes were various. In the first place the general expressions of opinions from prominent railroad officials as to the eventually extreme beneficial effect upon earnings of the respective parties, to sell from the ratification of the Trunk line agreement had a favorable influence. Secretary Carlisle's speech at the chamber of commerce dinner was well received. On the other hand the total of gold shipments for the week to date was increased by \$1,000,000, to be forwarded by to-morrow's steamer, making the aggregate exports \$2,750,000. Despite a reduction in the rates of sterling exchange which was announced late in the afternoon and was due to the offerings of gold bills further shipments of gold are expected to be made on Saturday, the estimates ranging up to \$4,000,000. The market started inactive and weak and the bears had a good grasp to the speculation during the forenoon and caused sharp recessions in a number of leading shares. About 1 o'clock a rally began and in the upward movement throughout the list. Prices at the top were above yesterday's final figures and in some cases showed material gains. The closing was dull and strong at about the best figures of the day.
