B. Y. P. U. The Sixth International Convention of the Baptist Young Peoples' Union of America will be held at Milwaukee, Wis., July 16, 17, 18, and 19, 1896. The B. Y. P. U. of all parts of the world will be heard from during this great convention. RATES. Excursion tickets to Milwaukee and return will be sold at approximately one fare for the round trip. Tickets will be on sale July 13, 14, and 15. Tickets will be good for return passage leaving Milwaukee as late as July 22, and if sold at points more than 150 miles distant from Milwaukee may be used for return as late as August 5, if deposited with the Joint Agent of the terminal lines at Milwaukee not later than July 20. The committee have arranged for entertainment in the homes and boarding-houses of Milwaukee at the following rates: \$1.00 to \$1.50 per day—three meals and lodging; or \$3.50 to \$6.00 per week. BRITISH LORD CHANCELLOR. New York Tribune: The Lord Chancellor is the only member of the British Cabinet who is not allowed to go outside of Great Britain. This is because he must have the great seal in his personal custody, and to take the great seal outside of Great Britain would almost be an act of high treason. When Cardinal Wolsey was Lord Chancellor he took it with him on a visit to France, and thereby hastened his fall, in the opinion of many. The great seal, which is a double silver die into which molten wax is poured when an impression is required for a State document, was once used for culinary purposes. While Lord Chancellor Brougham was staying, in 1833, at Rothiemurchus, the Scottish residence of the then Dowager Duchess of Bedford, the ladies of the party got possession of the great seal and hid it, much to the Lord Keeper's distress of mind, for he feared it was lost. He was blindfolded by the ladies and sent to search for it in the drawing-room. At last, to his intense joy, he dragged it forth from a tea chest, and then, to celebrate its recovery, used it for making pancakes in the kitchen.
