Notice of Intention to Apply For Letters Patent.

Notice is hereby given that the McFarland Fruit Protection company intend to apply to his excellency William S. Jennings, governor of Florida, upon the 15th day of March, A. D. 1901, or as soon thereafter as practical for letters patent upon the proposed alteration and amendment of its charter hereto attached:

Proposed Alteration and Amendment of the Charter of the McFarland Fruit Protection Company.

Article II of the charter of this corporation is hereby altered and amended so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE II.

The general nature of the business to be transacted will be the protection of fruit trees and other plants from damage by cold or insects, and all business incidental thereto, including the manufacture and sale, or leasing of devices for affording such protection, as well as the buying and selling of crops of fruit and the like, or the handling of such crops upon commission, and to own, hold, buy, sell and lease real estate, to grow all kinds of fruits, to own and take mortgages or other securities, to own and operate suitable cars for the transportation of fruits, and to own and operate vessels and steamers.

Second.—Section I of article III of said charter is hereby amended and altered so as to read as follows:

Sec. 1. The amount of capital stock authorized at this time is \$200,000, consisting of \$50,000 "common stock, first issue" already issued and fully paid up, as stated in this section in the original charter, and \$150,000 of common stock to be hereafter issued, making the total capital stock of this corporation \$200,000. There shall be no preferred stock, all of the same issued having been surrendered to this company. The said \$150,000 increased common stock shall be paid for in property, labor and services as follows: \$10,000 of the preferred stock of this corporation issued and surrendered to this corporation and cancelled, of the value of \$50,000 and labor and services already rendered, and merchandise and machinery now owned by this company, and devices, processes and inventions for the protection of trees and fruits from cold, and right of United States patent thereof, for which patent has now been applied for, and secret processes for the preservation of cloth, which process is now owned and used by said company, and valuable, long time contracts for protecting citrus fruits on the basis of one-third or more of each crop of said fruits protected each year, which contracts are now owned by this corporation, all of the value of \$100,000. Said \$150,000 of increased stock being fully paid up in the above described property.

Third.—Section 2 of article III of said charter is hereby altered and amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. The stock of this corporation shall be divided into shares of \$100 each.

Fourth.—Section 3 of article III of said charter shall be altered and amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 3. The capital stock of this corporation may be increased in the manner provided by law.

Fifth.—Sections 4 and 5 of Article III of the charter of this corporation are hereby repealed, annulled and made void.

Sixth.—Section 6 of article III of the charter of this corporation is hereby altered and amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 6. Certificates of stock shall be numbered and bear the signature of the president and secretary of the company and the impression of its corporate seal.

The McFarland Fruit Protection company, by Robert Amory, its president, and W. H. McFarland, its secretary, does hereby certify that the above alteration and amendments of charter of said corporation was adopted by three-fourths of its stock at a meeting of said corporation held at the office of the company at Titusville, Florida, on Feb. 9th, 1901, and that four week's notice was given of the time, place and object of said meeting prior to Feb. 9th, 1901, by publication in the East Coast Advocate, a newspaper published in Brevard county, Florida, and two week's notice to each and all of the stockholders of said corporation served personally on, or mailed to the usual postoffice address of said stockholders at least two weeks prior to said meeting.
