SUPREME COURT UP WITH IT'S WORK

Is Devoting Time Now to the Disposal of Current Work.

In the course of the splendid inaugural address delivered by Governor W. S. Jennings upon the occasion of his induction into office on January 8, 1901, he recommended the creation by the legislature of a temporary commission to adjudicate and dispose of certain cases to be allotted to it by the justices, to enable the supreme court to dispose of accumulated cases and clear the docket speedily; and the establishment of another division of the supreme court by constitutional amendment.

Governor Jennings' plan for remedying the evil has proven itself an exceedingly wise one. The court has at last caught up with all its accumulated work, and is now devoting its time to disposing of current work.

At the beginning of the January term, 1905, of the supreme court, there were nine old cases on the docket undisposed of. Ninety-two new cases were brought to the January term, making a total of 101 cases. There has been decided thus far during the January term, which extends to the second Tuesday in June, 13 cases. It is very probable that at the close of the present term there will be no undecided cases on the docket to be carried over.

Thus, for the first time in at least twenty years, the people of Florida are now enjoying the constitutional guaranty that right and justice shall be administered without delay. The justices of the court and the people are to be congratulated upon the achievement of this desideratum, than which there was none more important in the needs of Floridians, the justices because of the arduous and faithful services which they have, individually and collectively, rendered in the herculean task of clearing the docket of the great volume of accumulated business, and the people because the evils so aptly described in the platform declaration above quoted have been remedied.

The justices of the supreme court have no sinecure. There are very probably no public officials and very few private citizens who do harder work, or more of it, than these judges. It is grinding work of the most wearing nature, and it is really a double sacrifice for the justices to slave with this work as they do, for any of them could easily win greater financial reward at the bar and at the same time live lives of greater leisure and less of the tremendous responsibility which attaches to a supreme court justiceship.

The opinions of the Florida supreme court rank very high throughout the country, and they have seldom been overruled in the few appeals which have been taken to the United States supreme court. The people may well feel proud of this high tribunal, as well as gratified that the assistance rendered to it in the last four years has enabled the court to relieve litigants and insure to the people that "right and justice shall be administered without delay."

TO DRAIN THE EVERGLADES.

The trip from which Governor Broward and party returned last week was their second inspection of the Everglade section within two weeks. They have, therefore, seen the Everglades along both coasts, and have also traveled through the middle of the great area of sawgrass, which they declare contains some of the richest lands in the world for agricultural purposes.

More fully convinced than ever is every one in the party that the whole of the everglades can be reclaimed by a system of drainage canals, and also that the reclaiming of these lands will make Florida one of the richest states in the union.

At the head of the Matanzas river they found a dredge at work cutting a canal toward the headwaters of the Halifax river. Driving across the intervening strip, which they estimated to be about seven miles wide, they found another large dredge at work cutting a canal toward the Matanzas river. The strip of seven miles is the only part of the entire trip that was not made by water.

All in the party were very favorably impressed by the progress being made on the Matanzas Halifax cut. They say that when this cut is completed there will be an inside route all the way from St. Augustine to Miami.

They found the St. Lucie river to be a deep stream, there being at least ten feet of water at the point it comes out of the glades and beyond which it is not navigable. A canal cut across Lake Okeechobee, from the head of Saint Lucie river, would give a direct outlet for that lake to the Atlantic ocean and, the members of the party believe, would accomplish great results in the way of drainage. They favor such a canal, cut 200 feet wide, and of sufficient depth for the navigation of stern-wheel steamboats. Such a canal would give a direct water route from the Atlantic to the gulf. By this route a boat could enter the Saint Lucie river, pass through the canal into Lake Okeechobee, thence through the canals connecting the lake with the Caloosahatchee river and down that river to Fort Myers, and on to Punta Rassa, on the gulf coast.

The canal system is not to be confined to the Everglades, however, for the plans discussed include an inland water route from Jacksonville to Punta Rassa, on the gulf coast. Such a project, broached some years ago, would have been hooted at, but it is believed to be feasible and practicable.

It is evident from what the governor has had to say to Superintendent Miles and other officials of the canal company, and also to the press representatives who have interviewed him, that the drainage plans, with a view to important internal transportation improvements, will be so presented as to become one of the policies of the administration. Gov. Broward's first message to the legislature of Florida will contain an expression of his views in regard to the state inaugurating a system of internal improvements that will include the drainage of the swamp and overflowed lands, which were granted to the state by the national government.

Recently the British government so far recognized the importance of the wireless system as to permit wireless telegrams to be handled through the postal telegraph offices of the United Kingdom. Commenting upon this, the London Daily News says there could hardly have been a more brilliant opening for the scientific side of the new year than lies in the simple fact that from the smallest British country village the word "Lucania" will be a sufficient telegraphic address for a vessel that is plowing the Atlantic.
