

SUICIDE AT SPRINGFIELD.

Kentuckian Cuts His Throat in Hotel Room. SPRINGFIELD, Mo., Feb. 20.—J. M. Davidson was found dead in his room in a hotel in this city, having slashed his throat in a terrible manner with a razor, severing the jugular vein. He made careful preparations for the deed, having placed a bowl for the blood.

Davidson arrived here on the night of Feb. 17 from Memphis and registered at the hotel as from Glasgow, Ky. He appeared somewhat nervous and retired to his room at once. The next morning one of the guests, learning he was from Kentucky, asked Davidson what he thought about the assassination of Governor Goebel. He replied that he did not know anything about it, and after that avoided talking with anybody about it.

It was noticed by several guests that Davidson avoided talking on the Kentucky situation, but they also noticed he was greatly interested in all the newspaper accounts of the Goebel shooting and his death. He got up every morning at 6 o'clock and secured the morning paper and always read the Kentucky news, after which he would put the paper aside and would leave the hotel shortly after breakfast. As soon as the evening papers arrived at the hotel he would anxiously read the Kentucky news and nothing else.

Sunday night he retired as usual, but was late in coming down, which caused the clerk to go to the door and knock. Receiving no response, he looked over the transom and saw a ghastly sight. Davidson was stretched on the floor with his head in the wash bowl and deep gashes in his neck. He was nearly dressed and had his collar on. His hand grasped a razor, around the handle of which he had wrapped a handkerchief. The body was still warm. Davidson left no statement nor anything to show his identity.
