A MAMMOTH AUDITORIUM.

Kansas City Prepared to Entertain the Convention. KANSAS CITY, Feb. 23.—Convention hall, where the national Democratic convention will be held in July, has been classed by travelers as one of the largest and most perfectly constructed auditoriums in existence.

The total seating capacity is nearly 30,000 and with standing room, the building is capable of holding more than 22,000 people. The arena alone seats 4,000. To each side of the arena and under the first balcony are numerous committee rooms, which have their separate street entrances. The building has no stairways, the upper seatings being reached by means of inclined planes. Separate exits are used for the balconies and roof garden, and it is estimated that the hall can be emptied at the rate of 4,000 people a minute.

The building was erected at a cost of \$2,500,000, raised entirely by public subscription. It occupies a piece of ground 34x330 feet in extent, is two stories high and is built of native stone, cream brick and terra cotta. The first story is of the renaissance style of architecture, and the second story is peristyle form with groups and columns. The building is of bridge construction, without a column, the roof being supported by great steel girders that span its 300 feet of breadth. Its general seating arrangement is modeled somewhat upon the plan of the Metropolitan Opera House, New York. The floor space is divided into arena, arena balcony, balcony and roof garden, boxes skirting the arena and arena balcony. The stage is situated in the center of the arena.

Its acoustic properties have received special praise. Hon. William J. Bryan, who last June addressed the head camp of the Modern Woodmen of America in the hall, said later:

"It is hard to conceive how Convention hall could be improved upon for the purposes of large public gatherings."

BRYAN IN THE GATE CITY.

Delivers a Stirring Speech at the State Capitol.

ATLANTA, Feb. 23.—Hon. William J. Bryan arrived here this morning from Columbus, Ga. He was met at the train by a committee from the Young Men's Democratic League of Fulton county and conducted to the residence of Colonel Albert Howell, who entertained him during his stay in the city.

At noon Mr. Bryan held a reception at the Kimball House where an immense crowd took advantage of the opportunity to shake the hand of the distinguished Democratic leader. The time was selected so that laboring men could take advantage of the noon hour to meet him.

After the reception Mr. Bryan returned to the residence of Colonel Howell for lunch. In the afternoon he enjoyed a carriage drive over the city and was shown the principal points of interest.

Mr. Bryan spoke tonight at the capitol, in the hall of the house of representatives, every available foot of space being occupied by eager listeners. He was introduced in a brief speech by Edgar Latham, president of the Young Men's Democratic League. Mr. Bryan held his large audience in rapt attention while he presented a masterful discussion of the national issues which voters will be called upon to decide at the presidential election this year.
