WILL STICK TO THE DEATH.

Boer Sympathizers Think Cronj Will Hold On.

NEW YORK, Feb. 24—According to advices from London to the New York papers, there are rumors afloat that Ladysmith and Mafeking have been relieved and it is again reported that Cronj has surrendered. The war office, however, has not confirmed any of these stories. There is much excitement in the streets at the war office and the newspaper offices, and the rumors of British victories are received with more credence than heretofore. The splendid fight of Cronj has excited warm admiration in London, but the belief is general that his struggle is hopeless. It is believed in London by many war experts that Cronj is playing a desperate game of shrewd Boer tactics.

So far no report contains any mention of the capture of the Boer big guns. Of all the artillery about Magerfontein and Kimberley, only one disabled 12-pounder was found when the British occupied the ground.

It is said that Cronj started all the guns from their places, with orders to get them across the Vaal as soon as he learned that Lord Roberts was at Modder river with reinforcements, and moved himself and all the mounted Boers as soon as he learned of General French's movement in his rear.

Observers in London think he went as fast as he could, then picked a position and determined to sit tight, unassured that the artillery had escaped.

Cronj's plan appears to be to hold all the British possible about his camp until certain his artillery's retreat is assured.

The proposed armistice would have gained 24 hours for the re-ear of the guns, while the agreement would only have covered the fighting force engaged at that point.

Boer sympathizers think Cronj will hold fast until the last moment and that then orders will be given "every man for himself," with instructions to rally at a point north where the artillery will be safe in a new position.

It is insisted that this plan was followed about Ladysmith, the guns being slowly and safely removed to defend the Transvaal passes, while a mobile force was left in the trenches to prevent sudden attack by the British.

To Prevent Bribery.

FRANKFORT, Ky., Feb. 24—The Democratic senate has passed a bill making it unlawful for corporations to subscribe to or contribute money to political campaign funds. The penalty for violation of the law is a fine of from \$300 to \$5,000 or revocation of charter, or both.

The senate also passed the Coleman antitrust bill, which prohibits the operation of pools, trusts and combinations of either persons, firm or corporations, which seek to raise or lower market values and imposes heavy fines in addition to forfeiture of the right to do business in the state after conviction.

Kentucky Mineral Development.

KNOXVILLE, Feb. 24—A special from Middleboro says William Pardee of Pennsylvania has bought 10,000 acres of coal and timber land near Crab Orchard, Va. He will at once build a railroad connecting his land with the Louisville and Nashville at Big Stone Gap, Va. Abram Luntz of New York city, has secured options on 100,000 acres of valuable mineral and timber lands in Harlem, Perry and Letcher counties, Ky.

LONDON ON THE QUI VIVE.

Eagerly Expecting Confirmation of Cronj's Surrender.

LONDON, Feb. 24—The dispatch from Paardeberg, dated Thursday, Feb. 22, made public this afternoon, shows that the condition of General Cronj apparently had not changed for the better or worse up to Thursday and confirmation of the Durban report announcing General Cronj's surrender is eagerly awaited.

The arrival of the British supply column at Paardeberg may have given General Roberts the opportunity to resume his fierce attack on General Cronj's larger for, doubtless, he could not keep up the vigorous cannonade with which he started. Possibly the long wait may be due to a determination to endeavor to starve out General Cronj's gallant force.

From General Buller there is nothing new, but the retreat of General Cronj seems to be having an effect upon the Cape Boers, as a Dordrecht dispatch, dated Feb. 22, says they have opened negotiations for submission. General Brabant is treating with them and in deference to the wishes of the governor of Cape Colony, Sir Alfred Milner, is offering lenient terms, in the meanwhile ceasing offensive operations.

A special from Arundel, under date of Feb. 23, says:

"The Boers have formed a strong force 7 miles west of here. General Clements has kept up a searching fire on their kopjes. We expect to take their position before sunset."

A Sterkstroom dispatch of Feb. 22 asserts that Boers have admitted losing 500 men on the assault on Ladysmith, Jan. 5, and that it was true General Joubert was no longer in command. He added that some Free Staters were publicly begged for cowardice, after the battle of Belmont.

The British casualties at Koodoosberg drif, Feb. 7, and Klip kraal, Feb. 16, were seven officers wounded, four men killed and 96 wounded.

WESTERN RAILROADS

OBJECT TO THE DATE

Of the National Democratic Convention, July 4.

SERVICE WILL BE TAXED

Officials Fear the Midsummer Holiday Traffic Will Interfere With the Accommodations—Meeting Called to Discuss the Emergency.

KANSAS CITY, Feb. 24—Local railway officials are wrought up over the complicated situation that they assert is presented by the Democratic national committee fixing the date for their convention in this city on July 4.

Regular Fourth of July excursions, beginning on July 3 and running to 5, they say, will allow the facilities of the railways to the utmost limit. With a view to meeting the exigency which is pronounced almost insurmountable, a meeting of the local passenger association to devise ways and means has been called.

BREWER DENIES CHARGES

Of Crookedness in Matter of Senator Gallinger Investigation.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24—The forthcoming appendix to the annual statement prepared by Commissioner Mark S. Brewer, who was chairman of the committee designated to investigate the charges against Senator Gallinger of unlawful assessment of federal officers-holders of New Hampshire in the canvass of 1898, is in reply to certain allegations of Senator Chandler against the commission and Mr. Brewer, which charges, Mr. Brewer says, are found in copies of letters "reporting to have been signed by Senator Chandler and Mr. Basiel and addressed to the president" on Aug. 10, 1899. In the correspondence mentioned the removal of Commissioner Brewer was requested.

Commissioner Brewer takes up in detail each charge preferred against him and denies every allegation of wrongdoing. Among other things he states that he did not seek the position as chairman of the commission which investigated the charges against Senator Gallinger, but was persuaded by the other members of the committee to take it; that he did not prejudice the case and is even now undecided as to the merits of the question, but is certain that sufficient proof to convict was lacking.

It was part of his duty, he says, to inform witnesses that they were not bound to give evidence that would work to their own injury. Collusion with either side is denied. The whole investigation, it is stated, was conducted in accordance with the procedure agreed upon by members of the committee and was carried on in a fair and impartial manner and no means were left unexploited to arrive at the facts.
