The Work of Grading is Proceeding Satisfactorily. When President Van Praag began the work of grading on the Pensacola & North-western railroad two weeks ago at the summit of the hill on North Olva street, THE NEWS noted the event and described the opening incidents. This morning another visit was paid to the locality, and the progress made was found to be not only surprising but exceedingly gratifying. From the point where the work was commenced, in each direction, the entire surface of the right of way, 80 feet wide, has been thoroughly cleared of shrubs, trees, stumps, etc., and was smooth as a floor. On the southern slope of the hill, towards the "Butcher Pen pond," grading has been zoned on, with a width of 30 feet at several points, leaving a 20-foot drive-way on either side, thoroughly cleared and, wherever necessary, graded for the easy passage of vehicles. Besides this, wherever a street or road crosses the railroad, a grade crossing has been made, so that travel is not interrupted at any crossing point. The entire section from a point a quarter of a mile north of the hill southward to the Butcher Pen pond, the stakes indicating the grade-area have been set for the guidance of the force of laborers engaged in the work. President Van Praag states that he will soon be able to secure a title to the right of way, and the probability is that by this time next week the force will be greatly enlarged. He pays off at the close of every day's labor, and does not owe a cent for labor thus far, and does not intend to.


