URNS STATE'S EVIDENCE.

Sergeant Golden Will Be Put Up by the Prosecution.

LOUISVILLE, March 20.—The stories growing out of the conference between Sergeant F. Wharton Golden of the Barbourville company of state militia and the attorneys who are managing the investigation of the assassination of Governor Goebel have caused a sensation throughout the state.

Wharton will be placed on the stand by the prosecution in the trial of the persons already arrested for alleged complicity in the assassination, but information as to the exact nature of the testimony he is expected to give is lacking.

They Pay the Rent.

"There is," says a traveler, "a stock saying which they have at Queens-town, Ireland. It is there the steamers pick up the mails, which can leave London 12 hours later than the boats do Liverpool and overtake them there. Adhesive and Pressed Stamps.

"Wait until I have washed off the postage stamp on this envelope, spoiled in the addressing," said a man.

"It is not necessary to do that, as is commonly supposed," said a lawyer. "You may take your scissors and cut out the adhesive (not the impressed stamp and stick it fast to your new envelope with masticage notwithstanding the adhering piece of the old envelope.

"It does not look nice and may become detached in the mail, but if the stamp is a genuine, unused, adhesive stamp it is not questioned. The government when it sells an adhesive 2 cent stamp undertakes for such consideration to transport and deliver to destination the letter to which it is affixed. The fact that it has a piece of an envelope to which it was formerly attached, but not used or deposited for mailing, does not relieve the government to execute its part of the contract when the letter is deposited for mailing, the stamp being otherwise perfect.

"An impressed stamp, however, cut from an envelope is defective and invalid for postage purposes. It is astonishing how many of these are used, some people apparently being unable or too ignorant to discriminate between adhesive and impressed stamps."—Washington Star.

DAVIS WILL OPPOSE DELAY.

Will Urge the Early Ratification of the French Treaty.

WASHINGTON, March 20.—Senator Davis, chairman of the committee on foreign relations and in charge of the French reciprocity treaty, states that, notwithstanding the purpose to extend the time for the exchange of ratifications, he proposes to do all he can to obtain ratification during the present session.

The senator is preparing a careful statement showing the advantages to American interests which will attend the operation of the treaty. The senator will set forth that the treaty is a fair bargain for both powers.

No doubt exists at the French embassy to extend the time of ratification for the year proposed.

WASHINGTON, March 20.—Mr. Sulzer in the house delivered a scathing denunciation of the administration's pro-English course; charging that it did nothing without the consent of Downing street; that the action of Secretary Hay was taken on the suggestion of Lord Salisbury.

THE COOKBOOK.

When you have finished frying, allow the fat to cool a little, then pour it through a gray strainer into the proper bowl. Thus any loose crumbs, pieces of batter, etc., are taken away at once.

Try potatoes (boiling) with a sharp thin bladed knife. They will not slip apart as they do when they are tried with a fork, which acts like a wedge, and they will not show where they are pierced.
