

THE SELMA EXCURSION.

The General Committee Names the Date for April 24th.

Pursuant to a call, the general committee of citizens having in charge the arrangement for the entertainment of a proposed excursion, to be composed of citizens of Selma, to celebrate the opening of the new railroad between that city and Pensacola, met at the room of the Chamber of Commerce at 12 o'clock today.

Mr. F. C. Shepard of the L & N. R. R., being present upon invitation briefly addressed the meeting, explaining what had been done so far, and urging the appointment of a date for the excursion. He stated that the movement for an excursion, so far as the railroad was concerned, originated with himself, because of his long and intimate social and business relations with the people of Selma, and that he was only too glad that the people of Pensacola had, almost simultaneously, inaugurated a similar movement.

After an informal discussion, Mr. C. F. Zeeck moved that the time for the excursion be set for April 24th, which was carried. At this point Mr. Shepard, who was obliged to leave on the mid-day train, retired.

The meeting then took up the question of sleeping accommodations, and after considerable discussion it was moved and carried that the matter be referred, as heretofore, to the entertainment committee, subject to the limitation that the entertainment fund should remain at \$500, as originally fixed.

The question of the manner of issuing the invitations was also discussed, and on motion it was determined that the invitation committee, having full power to act, should co-operate with Mr. Shepard and his representative, Mr. J. W. Lorton.

During the discussion of the matter of sleeping accommodations, Capt. Kryger of the Merchants hotel stated that the hotels would probably be as crowded at the date named as they are now, and suggested that the committee should be charged with the duty of ascertaining where sleeping accommodations could be procured. Several members expressed the conviction that if the public houses of entertainment could not be depended upon for all the accommodations needed, the citizens should be called upon, according to their ability, to open their homes for the entertainment of the city's guests.

The matter of procuring the attendance of one or more Pullman sleepers was debated but abandoned as impracticable.
