THE IMMIGRATION BILL

Not to Be Pressed During This Session.

NATIONAL PARK FOR MINNESOTA.

Bill Introduced to Establish One at Fort Ridgely—Reed Enjoys His Freedom From Political Cares, Senators Who Dress Well.

WASHINGTON, March 28.—[Special.]—Neither in the senate nor house has there yet been any serious inclination to take up the immigration question, although in the last congress the measure was pushed with some vigor, and in fact at one time there was every indication that the Lodge bill would go through. Senator Lodge introduced a bill at this session, but there does not seem to be the desire to pass it that existed in the last congress. The fact is that Senator Lodge is not so greatly interested in the matter personally as he was in the last congress. Although he is still a member of the immigration committee, his chairmanship of the Philippine committee and his duties as a member of the committee on foreign relations have occupied so much of his time that he has been unable to give immigration matters the attention that he gave them heretofore. Senator Penrose, who reported the Lodge bill at this session, has had his time so occupied with the Quay case that he has not pushed the bill. It is scarcely possible that owing to the fact that the immigration bill is not popular among many foreigners it is not deemed altogether politic to press such legislation just before an exciting campaign.

To Commemorate McCreary a War.

Representative McCreary of Minnesota has introduced a bill to create a national park at Fort Ridgely, in his state. Perhaps no one knows who Ridgely was; probably he was some officer of note for whom was named a fort some many years ago when it was necessary to station troops in the Indian country. The site chosen was on the banks of the Minnesota river, well to the western part of the state. It might never have been anything had it not served as the defense of the whole of the state in one of the greatest Indian wars this country has known. It was this outpost which Little Crow and his fierce Sioux band attacked in 1852, but the greater glory of the civil war dwarfed this episode in the public mind. The western half of Minnesota was laid waste, thousands of people were massacred, and first and last, to put down the uprising, 25,000 men were sent to Fort Ridgely and a large store of ammunition. To capture this was the duty of the Sioux. There were Indians who could manage the big guns, and they were taken into the hands of the soldiers. The more thickly settled portions of the state in the east, and the cities of St. Paul and Minneapolis, have been threatened. This episode marks an important chapter in the history of the state. A monument has been erected to the men and women who defended the fort, and the women assisted in many ways. The site of the fort and the battle site are now a national park. It would be a fitting memorial to the men and women who defended this spot, to give it the little place in Minnesota in the history of the state.
