Broughton was having his score painted and at the request of the painter ordered some wood alcohol for mixing. Some of it was put into bottles labeled "root beer," and one of these bottles the painter left on a shelf. Supposing the bottle to contain root beer Broughton asked McEachern to have a drink and both drank. Twelve hours afterward Broughton was dead and McEachern was at the point of death, notwithstanding the best efforts of physicians.

CRISIS HAS BEEN REACHED.

Nicaragua and Costa Rica on the Verge of War.

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, March 30.—There is no longer room for doubt that an outbreak of hostilities may occur at any moment between Nicaragua on the one hand and Costa Rica and Salvador on the other. An offensive and defensive alliance exists between the latter government and Nicaragua by attacking one republic would be forced to fight both.

Extraordinary preparations on the part of the Nicaraguan government seem to precede war with Salvador and Costa Rica. The arrival of the United States cruiser Philadelpia and the report that the British cruiser Psyche has sailed from Kingston in response to a request from the British consul indicate that the crisis is well aware of the strained relations between the republics and are exerting all efforts to prevent British and American interests.

The effect of a war upon the construction of the Nicaragua canal and the relations between the government and the United States is problematical. A complete overthrow of the present government in the result from hostilities.
