

U. S. EMPLOYMENT SERVICE TO FURNISH 4,000,000 WORKERS

Nearest Way to Berlin for Employer and Employee Is Through Office of Nations Employment Bureau

Some intimation of the seriousness of the shortage of labor in the United States is gained from the fact that the government has turned over to the United States Employment Service the task of furnishing the war industries of the Nation with about 4,000,000 workers during the next twelve months.

In order to insure the presence of this vast industrial army at the right places, the employment service has nation's labor supply. The distribution of given complete control over the nation and recruiting of war labor from now will be in the hands of what is known as the Community Labor Boards, composed of representatives of the government, the employers and the employees of every district. The personnel of these boards in Arizona will be announced shortly.

The proposition that every employer and employe in Arizona, and this applies to ranching as well as to the industries, is that the U. S. Employment Service is the place to go from now if you want workers or if you want a job.

The supply of laborers in the United States is to be apportioned by quotas among the various states. If an employer fails to notify the nearest employment service office of his probable needs in workers for the near future, he is very apt to find himself without help when he will need it the worst.

Taking over of the recruiting and distribution of labor by the employment service was the result of a universal desire throughout the country that some central agency be entrusted with the work. Labor turnovers have reached a frightful proportion in many sections of the country, and it was to do away with the needless and wasteful shifting of war workers from one plant to the other that the recruiting and distributing plan was adopted.

Workers themselves are urged not to seek new fields of endeavor until they have first sought the advice of the officials at the nearest U. S. employment service office.

These offices in Arizona are located at Phoenix, Yuma, Flagstaff, Globe, Douglas, Prescott and Tucson.

Uncle Sam has entered into a partnership with the employes and the employers of the nation to produce the materials to whip the kaiser. For these two classes of Americans the nearest way to Berlin is through the office of the U. S. Employment Service. Start now.

UNCLE SAM RUNS WORLDS GREATEST EMPLOYING AGENCY

Employers and Employees Are Urged to Consult Uncle Sam When it Comes to the Employment Problem

Have you taken stock and made an estimate on the amount of unskilled labor that you will need in the near future? If you haven't, and you are an employer of skilled or unskilled labor you had better get busy or you are apt to find yourself with a lot of work on your hands and nobody to do it.

It's up to every employer of unskilled labor in Arizona, and this means the ranchers as well as the industrial establishments, to get in touch with the nearest office of the U. S. Employment Service and find out where he comes in on the war labor recruiting drive that is on now throughout the United States.

Uncle Sam now runs the greatest employment agency that the world has ever seen. It is known as the U. S. Employment Service. This organization is a branch of the U. S. Department of Labor and has taken the contract to supply Uncle Sam with about 4,000,000 workers for war industries during the next twelve months. The available supply of war workers in the United States is to be apportioned among the war industries of the country, by the employment service.

If an employer wants workers he must get them through the employment service, provided his plant employs one hundred or more workers. Unless all employers of workers, big and small alike, notify the U. S. Employment office of their needs for workers right now they probably will find in the future that the workers that they had figured on have been sent to other parts of the country to do war work.

As for the employe, he is urged not to plan moving to a "foreign" district to do war work until he has sought the advice of the nearest U. S. Employment officials. If he goes "on his own hook" he may find upon arriving at his destination that the employment service there has gotten another man for the job he went after. He cannot be hired at any big plant in the United States except through the government employment service.

"The right man for the right job"—that's the motto of the campaign to fill the nation's needs for war work.

If you want the right man ask the man at the employment service office. If you want to know if you are the right man ask the man at the employment service office. If the right men are brought together at the right time there will be small trouble in whipping the kaiser.

United States Employment Service offices in Arizona are located at Phoenix, Flagstaff, Tucson, Yuma, Prescott, Globe and Douglas. The one nearest to you will do.

DON'T POISON YOUR BATTERIES

"Batteries, like human beings are susceptible to poison," says Mr. Nicholas, chief electrician for Western Machinery Co., the local Willard Service Station. "When it comes to giving medicine to a battery, the only safe rule is to let an expert write the prescription and administer the dose—otherwise, the car owner is likely to find out that his battery has been killed instead of cured."

"There is one thing in particular that is just about as bad as any poison you could give your batteries. That is acid. Of course, there is acid in the battery solution, and a good many car owners will reason: 'If acid is what makes my batteries strong, then the proper thing to do when I think it shows a weakness is to add a little more acid. Then it should work better.'

"That's altogether wrong. You might as well say that because a few drops of some powerful drug are good for heart trouble, a whole bottle would give the patient a better heart than anybody in the country. Not even the worst patent medicine fiend would be foolish enough to believe that."

"But there are a lot of people who believe in drugging a battery in just this way, so they put in about a half pint of acid, when the battery only needs pure water."

"The only way to be safe about adding acid is to fight shy of it. If you think your batteries need acid, go to the service station and get advice from an expert who can tell you just what to do. Remember that he has the same relation to the health of your battery as a doctor has to your own health, with this exception—that the battery man doesn't charge anything for the diagnosis."
