

Order for Sale of Road and Hospital Bonds

WHEREAS at a meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Mohave County, Arizona, held April 15, 1920, said Board ordering the holding of a special election in said County for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers, who are qualified electors of said County, a proposition to issue \$300,000.00 Road Bonds of said County, the proceeds of said bonds to be used for the purpose of constructing and improving public highways of Mohave County, Arizona, generally in accordance with the suggestions, recommendations, and report of the Mohave County Highway Commission, on file in the office of the Board of Supervisors of Mohave County, Arizona, and a proposition for the issuance of \$80,000.00 County Hospital Bonds of said County, the proceeds from the sale thereof to be used in the construction of a County Hospital together with the necessary equipment and grounds therefor within said County, and

WHEREAS, more than a majority of the property taxpayers who voted at said election, voted in favor of the issuance of said \$300,000.00 Road Bonds and said \$80,000.00 County Hospital Bonds, and

WHEREAS it is now the duty of the Board of Supervisors of Mohave County, in the State of Arizona, to provide for the issuance of said bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MOHAVE COUNTY, STATE OF ARIZONA:

SECTION 1. There shall be issued and sold, \$300,000.00 Road Bonds of Mohave County, Arizona, dated June 1, 1920, payable serially in numerical order, \$10,000.00 on June 1 in each of the years 1931 to 1935 inclusive; \$15,000.00 on June 1 in each of the years 1936 to 1945 inclusive; and \$20,000.00 on June 1 in each of the years 1946 to 1950 inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of Six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually June 1 and December 1.

SECTION 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and shall have the corporate seal of Mohave County affixed thereto, and shall have coupons for interest attached, said coupons to bear the fac-simile signatures of said Chairman and said Clerk, and said bonds shall be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

MOHAVE COUNTY, in the State of Arizona, acknowledges itself indebted and for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), on the first day of June 19____, with interest thereon at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually June 1 and December 1, upon presentation and surrender of the respective coupons hereto attached as the same become due and payable, both principal and interest being payable in gold coin of the United States of America, of the present standard weight and fineness, at the office of the County Treasurer of Mohave County at Kingman, Arizona, or at the Seaboard National Bank in the City of New York, State of New York, at the option of the holder.

This bond is issued for the purpose of constructing and improving public highways in Mohave County, Arizona, under the authority of and in full conformity with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Arizona, including among others Chapter 31 of the Laws of Arizona, 1917, and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and pursuant to the authority conferred by the vote of a majority of the property taxpayers who are in all respects qualified electors of said County, voting at an election duly called, held and conducted in said County, on the eighth day of June, 1920, the result of said election having been ascertained and the returns thereof made, filed, reported and recorded as required by law.

This bond is exempt from taxation within the State of Arizona.

It is hereby certified, recited, and declared, that all acts, conditions and things, required to exist, happen or be performed, precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, have existed, have happened, and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and this bond, together with all other indebtedness of Mohave County, Arizona, does not exceed any limit prescribed by the Constitution or statutes of the State of Arizona, and provision has been made for the levy of annual taxes for the payment of the principal and interest on this bond, as the same become due and payable.

While said bonds or any of them remain outstanding and unpaid, there shall annually be assessed, levied, and collected, upon all the taxable property of said County, in addition to taxes for State and County purposes, at the same time and in the same manner as other County taxes are assessed, levied and collected, a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds when such interest shall become due, and said tax when collected shall constitute a fund for the payment of the interest on said bonds, and shall be called "Road Bonds of 1920 Interest Fund."

SECTION 5. While said bonds or any of them remain outstanding and unpaid, there shall annually be assessed, levied and collected upon all the taxable property of said County, in addition to all other taxes, and at the same time and in the same manner as other County taxes are assessed, levied and collected, a tax sufficient for the purpose of redeeming said bonds when the same shall mature, and all money derived from the levy of said tax when collected, shall constitute a fund and shall be called the "Road Bonds of 1920 Redemption Fund" and shall be used for the redemption of said bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 6. There shall be issued and sold, \$80,000.00 Hospital Bonds of Mohave County, Arizona, dated June 1, 1920, payable serially in numerical order, \$3,000.00 on June 1 in each of the years, 1931 to 1940 inclusive, and \$5,000.00 on June 1 in each of the years 1941 to 1950 inclusive, of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each numbered from 1 to 80 inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually June 1 and December 1.

SECTION 7. Said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and shall have the corporate seal of said County affixed thereto, and shall have coupons for interest attached, said coupons to bear the fac-simile signatures of said Chairman and said Clerk, and said bonds shall be in substantially the following form, to-wit:

This bond is issued for the purpose of constructing a County Hospital together with the necessary equipment and grounds therefor, in Mohave County, Arizona, under the authority of and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Arizona, including among others, Chapter 2, of Title 52, Revised Laws of Arizona, 1913, and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and pursuant to the authority conferred by the vote of a majority of the property taxpayers who are in all respects qualified electors of Mohave County, voting at an election duly called, held and conducted therein on the 8th day of June, 1920, the result of said election having been duly ascertained and the returns thereof made, filed, reported and recorded as required by law.

This bond is exempt from taxation within the State of Arizona.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen or be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, have existed, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and this bond, together with all other indebtedness of Mohave County, Arizona, does not exceed any limit prescribed by the Constitution or statutes of said State, and provision has been duly made for the levy of annual taxes to provide funds for the payment of the principal and interest of this bond as the same become due and payable.

While said bonds or any of them remain outstanding and unpaid, there shall annually be assessed, levied and collected upon all the taxable property of Mohave County, in addition to the amount of taxes which now or may hereafter be authorized by law for State and County purposes, and at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes are levied and collected in said County, a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds when such interest shall become due, and said tax when collected, shall constitute a fund for the payment of the interest on said bonds and shall be called "Hospital Bonds of 1920 Interest Fund."

SECTION 10. While said bonds or any of them remain outstanding and unpaid, there shall annually be assessed, levied and collected upon all the taxable property of Mohave County, in addition to the taxes for State and County purposes, and at the same time and in the same manner as other County taxes are assessed, levied and collected, a tax sufficient for the purpose of redeeming said bonds when the same shall mature, and all the money derived from the levy of said tax when collected, shall constitute a fund and shall be called the "Hospital Bonds of 1920 Redemption Fund" and shall be used for the redemption of said bonds as the same become due and payable.

THE FOREMOST American designers concede the wonderful talent of the French. In the conception and making of clothes, but they have arrived at the point of excellence where they are not afraid of comparisons. use of black chantilly flouncing in the rival frock. The skirt, of two flounces, is attached to a plain bodice with full pleatum. The long sleeves flare at the wrists and there is a fold of flesh-colored georgette at the front of the square neck. The girle-of blue satin ribbon slips under the pleatum at the front where two large roses are posed. The airiest of hats, of black malines and narrow ribbon, and black satin slippers with steel buckles are of the same aristocratic class as black chantilly lace.
