There was a large attendance at the skating rink last night, notwithstanding the threatening weather. Up to half-past nine the skaters had the floor, when they kicked off their skates and went whirling around the room to the excellent music of the Mexican orchestra. Dancing was continued about two hours and everybody enjoyed themselves. These kind of sociables would undoubtedly prove popular, and Messrs. Baron and Kirlew would receive the thanks of the dancing portion of the community.

We Kick. For the first time in many months this office registers a copper-bottomed, sheet-iron-lined emphatic kick, with both hind feet. We have borne many things and suffered much, and had become nearly resigned to our fate, but the last action toward us is too much for our system. We acknowledge generous supply of wine, wedding cake and other sweetmeats, and, although we are somewhat disfigured, we join with the many friends of the happy couple in wishing them a happy future and hope that their lives may never be marred by a single regret.

The Silver Convention. Governor Wolfley has received the following letter, which explains itself. "NATIONAL SILVER CONVENTION. SECRETARY'S OFFICE. 319 NORTH THIRD STREET. ST. LOUIS, OCTOBER 3, 1889. The Workman's Grievance. "What is the use of men preaching to me, about the saving of my soul in the other world when they do not care to expose to death here or work for fifty cents a day?" That is the expression of a workman made recently in the New York Herald. This statement, true or false, is significant, as it expresses the views of a large number of our fellow citizens. It points to the fact that both laborer and layman should study the condition of workmen, and their problem. That we may have arranged this duty, in part, is simply a fact. We should, perhaps, not think too much of heaven but more of earth. Religion is not something that is to be used as a tool, and should not be a life of great truth and duty, and causes us to despise the life, and better the condition of man. The church should harbor a man in this case for those in want or distress, and should not only preach the word of life, but demonstrate the practical side as well. The Christian Bible teaches a man to be kind to the laborer who may be poor. The Divine Gospel should not only be preached into the hearts of those that would pierce the veil of ignorance that separates us from our fellow man, but it should also come to help the oppressed, to lift up the fallen, and to bring happier and more contented and to make brighter the hearts of those who bless earth as well as people heaven.

The workman should become enlightened, his labor agitation, but may gain a healthy sympathy for the workman, that will insure the support of public sentiment when he in a proper way makes a just demand.

On the other hand we believe the criticism offered in the Herald was too severe. Some progress has already been made in the direction above indicated. The support given the striking workmen of the Leadville docks was a Christian effort, born of the religious spirit of humanity. It was a support that is sorely needed under like conditions in other human hands. We farther believe that the so-called labor problem that needs but a complete solution will be the restoration of the individual.

It is true that there may be and should be secured happier circumstances for the laborer by outside means. This may be secured, in part, by labor organization; by the cooperative plan of labor; by laws compelling employers to submit questions of dispute between themselves and employees to arbitration; by laws limiting the hours of a labor day. But these outside adjustments can never solve the problem, for there are many men who if they received five times their present wages would spend it in vicious living, and at end of a year fail to have a penny.

It is a part of the eternal conflict between right and wrong. There will be no end to it so long as there is the anarchical character. The character must be reformed, and this is accomplished from within. Then the workman can be reformed, and in reformation within, in both places the church should be and is in part interested. The working man should look upon the church as his ally.
