BRIEF ITEMS.

District court will convene in Tucson September 13.
 Hon. Ben M. Crawford of Clifton, was in Tucson during the week.

Attorney S. E. Hazzard is having a brick dwelling built on north Court street.
 Geo. H. Smalley is to be congratulated on his writup of the University of Arizona, which was published in the Arizona Republican of recent date.

Prof. Toumey, of the University, and his bride have taken passage at Liverpool for home, and may be expected in Tucson about September 10th.

New country brings with it new people and Tucson has a young novelist who "if his works take as his friends think they will," he will soon rank among the best writers.

Mrs. Hiram Stevens and daughter, Mrs. J. Knox Corbett and daughter, and Miss Marie Hughes have returned home from California. Hon. Sam Hughes and Miss Attie will return the middle of next month.

The regular quarterly meeting of the county board of examiners will be held at the office of the county school superintendent on Tuesday and Wednesday Sept. 7 and 8, when examination of all applicants for teachers certificates will be had.

Tucson's gun club is in a flourishing condition—it having obtained some fifty new members—all will join in a shooting tournament in a few days. Parties desiring to join will apply to Mr. Chas. F. Webber, who is authorized to accept and qualify them for full membership.

The San Xavier poultry farm was visited the other night by coyotes and the owners thereof lost over one hundred fowls. Fortunately they were able to replace them and now have everything in order as before having supplied their loss from Tucson parties. Among the new stock are a number of large Lang Shank roosters, which they intend to breed to the common stock to increase the size of market chickens.

District Clerk A. J. Halbert, yesterday placed his resignation in the hands of Judge Davis, to be acted upon at such date as the Judge may elect. Persons in such a position as to be supposed to know, very distinctly hinted (!) yesterday to the man from the Star that on or about the fourth prox. Jack Halbert's resignation would be accepted and the new appointee publicly announced.—Star.

Mrs. DeGross returned from her eastern trip on Friday morning. She accompanied her son, Bert Orndorff, to Highland Falls, New York, where he entered the National Preparatory Institute, conducted by Lieut. Brayden, which has a very high reputation. Bert goes there to prepare for his examination next March for a West Point cadetship, to which he has been appointed by the president through Arizona's congressional delegate. The board of trade committee appointed at Thursday evening's meeting on securing additional dwellings in our city, composed of Charles F. Hoff, E. J. Trippel and Dr. Matas, with Mr. Hoff as chairman, has already gone to work in earnest. Mr. Hoff states that he has already found four of our citizens who have means and each are desirous of building several good cottages for renting, but are for the present deterred by the unsettled state of the question of a water supply. The chairman of

this committee desired to have it stated that the committee would at any time during their labors be glad to receive suggestions, or knowledge of facts tending to further the object they have in view.—Star.

Last Wednesday evening a meeting of the stock growers of southern Pima met in the office of Attorney C. W. Wright in this city, for the purpose of organizing the fall rodeo, and the transaction of such other business as would come before the meeting. The round ups were divided into four districts, No. 1, 2, 3 and 4, as follows: No. 1 to begin at Tucson and work up the Santa Cruz river to Tubac and ending at Sopari; No. 2 begins at the Black Hills and works south to Arivaca creek; No. 3 will start at Sopari and extend to Arivaca creek where it meets No. 2; No. 4 is a consolidation of Nos. 2 and 3, working in Altar flats and northern Sonora. Upon motion it was decided to do away with the old system of having the foreman of each range upon which the round ups are held, foreman of the round up, and one foreman was elected for each district to have charge of each round up from the beginning to end, as follows: Chas. Proctor, district No. 1; Ramon Ramirez, district No. 2; Jose

Vega, district No. 3; Carmen Acevedo, district No. 4. A committee of five was appointed, consisting of Chairman Wright, Secretary Ramon Soto, Juan Elias, George Pusch and Zack Vail, for the purpose of perfecting a permanent organization, defining the objects and prescribing the work of the association.—Citizen.
