

BRIEF ITEMS.

No town in Arizona is improving more rapidly than Tucson.

Arcus Raddoch of Nogales, is stopping in Tucson with his sister Mrs. H. J. Wood.

The clerk of the board of supervisors has completed the tax roll for the current year.

Tucson will soon have the largest opera house in Arizona. The new one will be completed soon and it will seat 900 people and will have all the modern improvements.

The business men of the old pueblo are not doing any kicking, even if the Republican wave of prosperity has not hit them. They are all doing a good business and have no complaints to make.

R. Humphrey, a young Englishman from Los Angeles, left Tucson last evening on a visit to the Empire ranch. He will assist in the rodeos during the next month. Mr. Humphrey has a brother who has just passed over Chilcot Pass, and is now at Dawson City. As he packed a 600 pound outfit over the Pass on his own back, making many trips with 50 to 80 pounds at a time, it will be easy to see that the unpleasant features told of the Klondyke are not exaggerated.—Star.

Articles of incorporation have been filed for the Building & Improvement Association, with its principal place of business the city of Tucson. The aim of the incorporators, as set forth in the articles of incorporation, is "the accumulation of a fund from contributions, fines, premiums, loans, interest and rents, for the purpose of building new dwelling houses, purchasing lots or parcels of land for that purpose, and to loan any surplus money, which is not or cannot be used for the purpose of building new dwelling houses." A COMPLIMENT.

Grand Jury Report on Treasurer's Office.

To the Foreman of the Grand Jury: Your committee to investigate the office of the county treasurer have performed their duty assigned them and beg leave to make the following report: Itemizing receipts during September, and balance, \$27,059.02, which amount we counted and found correct.

The books are a marvel of neatness and would do credit to any banking institution. The treasurer called our attention to the insecurity of the vault door where the county books and papers are kept and we recommend that the board of supervisors have a new fire-proof door made without delay as in case of fire we would lose all of the county's most valuable books, papers, etc. As it is now it is worse than no door at all.

We find many valuable changes have been made in the system of keeping the books of that office, which is of great benefit to all persons who may have business with that office, as it shows all accounts and balances in a business-like manner. His publishing from time to

time all transactions of the office, thus giving the taxpayers of the county an inside view of what is being done with the public funds, ought to be appreciated by the taxpayers as the good work of a good officer. As tax collector we find he has been firm and just, showing no favoritism, making every tax-payer stand their just proportion to the end that the tax rate may be reduced.

We commend him for the stand he has taken in several tax collections on cattle, etc., thus saving the county from \$3,000 to \$4,000.
