TIRED OF LIFE.

An Old Pioneer of Arizona Shoots Himself.

Miguel Peralta committed suicide at about 4 o'clock yesterday morning in his room on International street. Deceased had been drinking and gambling till about 3:30 o'clock in the morning and had lost some money.

He had been out of work too since the failure of Mr. A. F. Paredes & Co. and though he seemed despondent at times no one thought he contemplated taking his own life.

Mr. Peralta was one of the old pioneers of Arizona and up to 1878 or 79 was was one of the biggest merchants in the territory. He owned a big store at Phoenix in 1878 at what is now the Goldman corner and also at the time had branch stores at Wickenburg and Vulture. He was a kind hearted man and during his palmy days many a poor prospector was the recipient of favors at his hands.

He leaves a wife and several children. His wife resides at Tucson. The funeral took place this morning at 10 o'clock.
