T. J. Ryan, formerly agent at Fairbank for the N. M. & A., returned last Sunday from a two week's vacation in San Francisco. Mr. Ryan was recently appointed postmaster at Tombstone, but said he might not accept the place.

A. F. Krouse, formerly connected with the resident engineer's office here, of the Southern Pacific Co., was in the city yesterday greeting his friends. He is still connected with the railroad company, being located at Lordsburg. —Tucson Star.

Conductor Harry Hay broke his leg last Monday at Batamotal. He was on top of a box car and when the train started up he fell between cars. Goodfellow was taken down to Guaymas on a special by Train Dispatcher Gibson, leaving here at 4:30 p. m. and reaching Guaymas at 2:10 a. m., making the run in a remarkably short time. SONORA NEWS.

Mining and Other Items from Our Sister State.

The Bonanza mine in the Sierra Pinta in the Altar district, has been sold and a first payment made.

In addition to the two French mining companies at Caborca in the Altar district, a new French company is about to be organized on account of the discovery of a new gold district at Coyote.

H. Menager came in from Caborca, Altar district, Tuesday. He reports a great deal of activity in the district and the development work that has been done on several prospects shows up in great shape.

The Chucubabe mine in the Altar district, has been finally paid for and a new mill erected. At 80 feet a fine body of gold ore was struck. Mr. Thompson, the owner, is to be congratulated on his rich discovery.

Mr. Menager reports that at the Cerro Prieto mine he has opened an ore body at a depth of over 200 feet with a ledge varying from five to twelve feet, the width of the ore body being 240

fect so far. Assays have averaged all the way from \$9 to \$15 in gold.

Thursday a miner went into Ortiz with some of the finest quartz and copper ore carrying free gold ever seen here. The gold bearing quartz is somewhat dark and the ledge eight feet wide. The copper ledge is five feet wide. The place of discovery is not over fifty miles from the railroad. More than this could not be learned.

Some Denver people have made a final payment on the Chanate mine near Altar and the plant is now running and making handsome money over all expenses. The extension on this mine promises to be almost as good as the main mine. An offer of \$5,000 having been refused for a quarter interest in the last few days.

M. de la Ville le Reuse, a French nobleman, came in from the City of Mexico Tuesday morning and left the same day for Caborca. While at the City of Mexico he was engaged in financing a large gold property near Caborca in which he met with unqualified success. It is expected he will return to Nogales on the 18th inst., on his way to Paris.

NO MONEY.

Black Jack's Gang Hold Up an S. P. Train.

At 8:35 Thursday night when the west-bound train on the Southern Pacific reached Stein's Pass station it was boarded by four masked men who took possession of the train and brought it over the hill and attempted to rob the express car. Detective Jenkins, of the Wells Fargo force, was in the express car. He killed one of the robbers and the others fled without having gotten any money.

The dead man had on his person a letter addressed to his mother and signed Edward H. Cullen. By telegraphic inquiry it was learned that such a man was known in Bisbee and had recently been under arrest there.

Two Wells-Fargo and S. P. posses were in the field on the trail within two hours after the holdup. The robbers left towards Skeleton Canyon where they killed Frank Robson last year.
