The Last Oasis Slander.

EDITOR VIDEITE—In the last issue of the Oasis is an article headed "An Illegal Contract," asserting that the board of supervisors let a contract to a county officer contrary to law, and without giving other persons wishing to bid on the same an opportunity. The whole statement is utterly false. Mr. Flewellyn was not a county officer, but a precinct constable only, and today is not a county officer, being only a jailor appointed by the sheriff. By direction of the whole board I was placed as a committee to invite all persons willing to bid to do so. There being no time in which to advertise in newspapers—the jail cells being expected on the ground by the 15th of June—I accordingly called on Mr. Jos. Thompson and asked him to make a bid, he said he would do so, but never put in a bid. I also called on Mr. Butterfield and Mr. Tritch and asked them to put in bids, and left the specifications with Mr. Tritch for over a week, they also never put in bids. I also spoke to Mr. Case and Mr. Otto Kreuger about bidding on the contract, and Mr. Kreuger did put in a bid, but it was so very much higher than that of Mr. Flewellyn's, which, was therefore rightfully and legally accepted. Now, the Oasis says Mr. Thompson and Mr. Butterfield have bids in writing offering to do the work for less than Mr. Flewellyn's contract. If they have written any such bids, which I do not believe anyway, seeing that it is stated only in the Oasis, it must have been lately written or hatched up in that office, for they have certainly never been presented or seen in the office of the Board of Supervisors.

School Bonds Sold.

Last Monday, the Nogales school board district opened the bid for the school bonds recently authorized by a vote of the people. The bids ranged from 2 1/2 per cent premium to \$18,001 50 cash for \$16,000 in seven per cent bonds. The bonds went to Trowbridge, McDonald, Niver & Co., of Chicago, who bid \$16,000 for a six per cent bond. The bidders were represented by Mr. Jas. H. Roy. Computing the difference in the interest during the life of the bonds and the bid accepted was the best by about \$400.

Four architects presented plans for the building—Geo. L. Grovesnor of Phoenix, Otto Kroeger and H. C. Trost of Tucson, and Ernest Crause of El Paso. The plans of Mr. Trost were accepted.—Citizen.

Our school trustees are receiving universal praise, for the able manner in which they have managed the business of handling the sale of the bonds. They have made a record in this matter second to none in the territory.

The Nogales school district have sold bonds, the proceeds of which are to be used to build a new school building. Recently plans for the building were presented by architects from Phoenix, El Paso and Tucson. The plans made by Architect H. C. Trost of this city were considered the best and accepted. The Nogales people made a wise selection.—Star.

The District Attorney's Letter.

Last week it was stated in these columns that the district attorney had written the board of supervisors a very severe letter, arraigning that body for its ill advised action in combating the claim against the county for services rendered by Jos. Thompson, when he was acting as jailor. Having held on Tuesday an impromptu meeting, attended by two of the board and the deputy boss of the county (Peg Lep.) the letter was read and now is legitimate public property. It reads as follows: NOGALES, A. T., May 25, 1899. HON. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, County of Santa Cruz, Territory of Arizona.

GENTLEMEN:—Against my advice, your Honorable Body saw fit to instruct me to combat the claim of one Joseph Thompson, amounting to \$105.00 in the Justice's Court of the First Precinct of this County. This, I have done, to the best of my ability, and the jury have rendered a unanimous verdict in favor of Mr. Thompson. I am now instructed by one member of the board to appeal the case, and I have given notice thereof. Now, please again take notice that in my judgment, the county cannot win this case, and it will simply mean added cost to proceed any farther. Further, in my opinion, the Board of Supervisors should forget their petty animosities and local town troubles, and look directly and solely to the interests of the whole county. But, if your Honorable Body desires to appeal, and deem in for the best interest of the tax payers, please advise me, at the same time inclosing \$89.70 gold coin, court costs which have accrued to date, and I will do my best to represent the County in the higher court.

Failed to Report

County Treasurer P. R. Brady, Jr., failed to make his quarterly statement and settlement with the Board of Supervisors last week as required by law, and the board this week instituted legal proceedings and suspended him from office. There seems to be a shortage of six or seven thousand dollars which his bondsmen will make up if those who have received the money do not disgorge. On account of the death of two of his children within the past week much sympathy is expressed for the ex-county treasurer, who seems dazed by the culmination of unfortunate events. It is more than probable that when Mr. Brady gets at himself once more he will be able to straighten matters out and his bondsmen will not suffer. The board of supervisors at its meeting yesterday appointed W. Y. Price, county treasurer, and that gentleman will take charge of the office as soon as his bond is filed. It is understood that George E. Truman will act as deputy. Both are thoroughly competent and reliable and will soon unravel the tangle.

It is learned that three or four Tucson gentlemen of means are on the bond, and further, that the Pinal county board of supervisors having failed to approve the bond it is invalid. Report goes that the shortage of Treasurer Brady will be over \$1100. He is quite well known in Tucson.—Florence Tribune.
