

FIRE NOTICE

New Siren Whistle Installed—How to Use Telephone in Case of Fire.

The Nogales Fire Department desires to give notice to all property holders and others interested that they have now completed installation of a siren whistle to sound the alarm of fire and that arrangements have been made with the Telephone Company for the placing of a sticker on each telephone, reading as follows:

"In case of fire, call for 'Fire Alarm Operator,' then state your name and the place from where you are telephoning; then give location of fire. The Telephone Company will do the rest."

Particular attention is called to that part of this notice which states that the party calling up the Fire Alarm Operator must in all cases, as a preliminary to having the alarm sounded, give their name, number of 'phone and place from where 'phoning. Simply yelling "fire" into the telephone receiver will not cause the alarm to be sounded. This information is absolutely essential and the operators have strict instructions under no circumstances to sound the alarm of fire until such information has been given. Further notice of districting the town and signals showing the location of the fire will appear later.



The case of Fred Darby, charged with burglary, was set for today, as was also the petit larceny case against Darby.

The case of grand larceny against Felipe Arbalio, resulted in a verdict of "Not guilty."

The case of Al Johns, accused of stealing and killing a cow from the Empire ranch, now on trial, is being followed with a great deal of interest. A number of prominent attorneys have been engaged to assist in the prosecution.

Rev. J. Heald in Nogales.

Rev. J. Heald, superintendent of the Congregational churches of Arizona and New Mexico, arrived in the city Monday night from Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he and his family now make their home. Several years ago Rev. Heald and family resided in Nogales, the gentleman being in charge of the local Congregational church.

He is making a tour of the territory visiting the churches under his supervision of which there are seven.

Tuesday evening Rev. Heald appeared before the Board of Trade and made an interesting talk regarding the Congregational Industrial Society, a national organization, which has established and is conducting five of these industrial schools in New Mexico. If proper co-operation can be secured, it is Rev. Heald's intention to establish an industrial school here in Nogales.

An industrial school such as is proposed by Mr. Heald would no doubt receive liberal patronage and should in a little while be made to pay substantial returns on the investment. Many boys and girls from Sonora, who are now sent to schools in California and other states to be educated, would enter the Nogales industrial school, which, like the New Mexico schools, will make a specialty of training boys and girls in the industrial arts.

Domestic economy is taught, the purpose being to train the girls in household affairs. The boys are trained in farming, blacksmithing, carpenter work and other industrial trades. Rev. Heald believes in teaching the hands how to work in harmony with the development of the mind.

While in the city Rev. Heald was chaperoned around by J. B. Bristol, who takes a great interest in church and educational work of all kind.

The proposition was turned over to the Town Improvement Committee of the Board of Trade, with instructions to report at the next meeting.
