SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FIRST.

Santa Cruz County Constitutional Democratic Club Organized.

Last Monday night pursuant to call of the Committee, a bunch of Santa Cruz County Democrats met at the Court House and organized the first Democratic club organized since the admission of Arizona as a state.

The name of the new organization is The Santa Cruz County Constitutional Democratic Club, and its members pledge their loyal support to the democratic principles as incorporated in the constitution of the state of Arizona and the principles as drafted into the constitution of the Club.

The meeting was called to order by Judge W. A. O'Connor who officiated as its chairman.

The following were unanimously elected permanent officers of the club: Frank J. Hobson, president; Captain L. W. Mix, first vice-president; W. A. O'Connor, second vice-president; Otto H. Herold, treasurer, and Robert E. Lee, secretary.

The objects of the meeting and the purposes and aims of the proposed Democratic club were clearly set forth in speeches made by Judge O'Connor, Judge Duffy, Captain Mix of Nogales, and C. H. Akers of Phoenix.

Dr. H. W. Purdy, Dr. A. A. Doherty and Judge W. A. O'Connor were appointed a committee to draft a constitution and by-laws to govern the club, the name selected for it being "The Santa Cruz County Constitutional Democratic Club."

A motion was made and carried that the president appoint a circulating committee to secure new members, and the following were appointed: Captain L. W. Mix, R. R. Earhart, W. G. Bowman and E. D. Miller, and a meeting of the committee was arranged to be held on Tuesday afternoon.

On motion made and seconded Charles H. Akers president and general manager of the Arizona Gazette, was unanimously elected an honorary member of the club, and Mr. Akers acknowledged the compliment and honor conferred on him with appropriate remarks.

The club then adjourned to meet this evening at 8 o'clock in the J. E. Wise building on Morley avenue, to which every Democrat in the county is cordially invited to attend.

The new club starts with great enthusiasm among its members, who propose to make it the strongest political organization in the state.

It is not intended that it shall be converted into a personal organization, in the interest of any individual or set of individuals for any office, but solely for the promotion of the Democratic party in general and the principles which it stands for as expressed in Arizona's constitution and reiterated in the platform of the Democratic party during the last campaign.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF INTERNATIONAL GAS COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, the undersigned and hereinafter named incorporators, have associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under and pursuant to the laws of the State of Arizona, and to that end have adopted and do hereby adopt the following articles of incorporation:

I. The names of the incorporators are Spiro S. Proto, H. W. Kelsey and W. F. Chenoweth.

II. The name of the corporation is and shall be INTERNATIONAL GAS COMPANY. Its principal place of business shall be at the town of Nogales, in the County of Santa Cruz and State of Arizona, and it may have branch offices at such points within the United States or in any foreign country. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, designate or establish, and may lawfully hold meetings of its Board of Directors and transact the business of the corporation at any such branch office or offices.

III. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by said corporation shall be as follows:

To manufacture and produce gas from oil or other material for heating, lighting, power and other purposes, and to furnish such gas to customers or consumers.

To generate and produce electricity for lighting, heating, power and other purposes and to furnish the same to customers or consumers.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire land, buildings, and improvements, pipes, pipelines, poles, wires, fixtures and appliances of every kind and necessary or proper for the carrying on of such business.

To hold, obtain, acquire and exercise franchises from municipal or other public authorities or the people of cities, towns and other municipalities for furnishing gas and electricity for the purposes aforesaid to the inhabitants of such cities, towns or other municipalities.

To acquire, own, hold and use rights of way or easements, franchises, licenses, permits, or other instrumentalities or appliances either in public streets or highways or elsewhere, necessary or proper for the carrying on of such business.

To purchase, or otherwise acquire, and to own, hold or control the stock, bonds or other obligations of any other corporation engaged or to be engaged in the business of generating or carrying on any like business, either in the United States or any adjacent foreign country.

To buy, own, sell and deal in gas fixtures, gas machinery, and appliances of every kind, and other fixtures and appliances of every kind.

To erect, construct, maintain and operate plants, machinery and appliances of every kind for the manufacture of gas, or the production of electricity, and to alter, enlarge or improve the same.

To loan money and to take as security for any such loans, notes, bonds, mortgages, deeds of trust, or other evidences of debt or security of every kind.

To borrow money or to incur indebtedness and to secure the payment thereof by notes, mortgages, deeds of trust, or other evidences of debt or security of any or all its property to secure such loans or other indebtedness.

Generally to do and perform each and every act or thing necessary, proper or convenient for the carrying on of such business.

IV. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) divided into one hundred thousand (100,000) shares of the par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) each; the said stock may be issued for subscription in cash, or in consideration of property, real or personal, or of securities, rendered, at the time when such subscriptions are to be paid in, or the transfer of other property used shall be at the time of the issuance of certificates of such stock, and shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors authorizing the issuance of such

stock, for cash, or for real or personal property, or securities, or in payment of this or any other indebtedness of this or any other corporation, partnership or person; to borrow or loan money, to give and receive mortgages, to hypothecate, mortgage, obtain rights of way, erect poles, string wires, and buy or sell electricity; also to bargain and contract for, buy, sell, lease, mortgage, and in any and every way and manner deal in and with goods, wares and in real estate, real estate, mines and mining machinery, engines in action, and other property in possession or in action or in expectancy, and to make, do and transact all and every kind of business of what nature and kind soever, to sign, acknowledge, execute and deliver such deeds, contracts, mortgages, promissory notes, hypothecations, lotteries, bills of lading, bills, bonds, notes, receipts, checks, orders, drafts, and satisfaction of mortgages, judgments and such other instruments of writing of whatsoever kind and nature as may be necessary or convenient or proper in the premises; to buy, procure, hold, own, sell, lease, mortgage, hypothecate, and otherwise acquire and operate railroads, ferries, tramways, stage lines, and any and all other means of transportation including equipment therefor, for mining or for any other lawful use or purpose; to buy, build, construct, manufacture, repair, own and operate, lease, sell, mortgage or otherwise hypothecate all kinds of boats, barges, steamships, sailing vessels, and all kinds of water craft, and to acquire, locate, manufacture, procure, construct, buy, hold, own, lease, let, demise, mortgage, maintain, operate, develop, distribute, transmit and furnish both for itself and others, water rights, water powers, electric lights, electric plants, electric power, steam power and any and all other kinds of power for any and all lawful uses and purposes; to treat, smelt, mill, stamp and reduce ores, metals, bullion and concentrates of every kind, nature and description; to erect, construct, buy, hold, own, lease, let, demise, mortgage, maintain, operate, develop, distribute, transmit and furnish both for itself and others, and any and all kinds of machinery, and parts and appliances incident or pertaining or necessary to such business; to carry on, do and perform every and all matters and things necessary or expedient or proper to carry out the purposes of this corporation or for which individuals may lawfully associate themselves together to perform, and generally to do and perform each and every act and thing which it is lawful for natural persons to do, all of which business or occupations may be carried on at such place or places as the Board of Directors shall deem for the best interests of the corporation.

V. The capital stock of this corporation shall be Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) divided into five million shares, (\$1.00) of the par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) each; and said stock shall be issued fully paid up in assessable shares such as the Board of Directors may designate, or in such shares, property, securities, or other valuable rights or things, and the judgment of the Board of Directors as to the value thereof shall be conclusive.

VI. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of filing of these articles of incorporation in the office of the State Auditor of Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be Twenty-five (25) years thereafter.

VII. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors, consisting of not more than five (5) persons, who shall be elected annually at the annual meeting of the stockholders, and shall hold their offices for the term of one year commencing with the year 1912. Special meetings of the stockholders may be held at any time and place as may be determined by the President and Secretary. At all meetings of the stockholders, any stockholder may vote in person or by proxy appointed in writing. Until the first annual meeting, the following named persons shall constitute the Board of Directors, viz: Spiro S. Proto, H. W. Kelsey and W. F. Chenoweth.

VIII. The Board of Directors shall have power to make, alter and amend the by-laws of this corporation, and to do all things which may be necessary or proper to carry out the purposes of this corporation.

IX. The undersigned, Spiro S. Proto, H. W. Kelsey and W. F. Chenoweth, do hereby certify that the foregoing articles of incorporation were read and approved by them, and that they have signed and sealed the same this 27th day of February, A. D. 1912.

X. The Board of Directors shall have power to make, alter and amend the by-laws of this corporation, and to do all things which may be necessary or proper to carry out the purposes of this corporation.

XI. The undersigned, Spiro S. Proto, H. W. Kelsey and W. F. Chenoweth, do hereby certify that the foregoing articles of incorporation were read and approved by them, and that they have signed and sealed the same this 27th day of February, A. D. 1912.
