Upon motion, duly carried it was ordered that the Treasurer and Tax Collector, be authorized to accept the sum of \$12.00 in full of all back taxes of E. C. Bartell for the year 1911, this amount having been sent by P. O. Money Order in January 1912, and lost. 5 00

Order from Corporation Commission in regards railroad crossings, read and ordered placed on file. 5 00

Upon motion, duly carried, it was ordered that the insurance on Court house building and contents be renewed in the sum of \$30,000.00 and the same be divided among the local agents, as follows: Mrs. Geo. B. Marsh, \$20,000, W. C. Budge, \$5,000, E. K. Cumming, \$5,000, 5 00

Upon motion, duly carried, it was ordered that a reward not to exceed \$50.00 may be offered at any time with the sanction of the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, and County Attorney, for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person charged with the commission of a felony in Santa Cruz County. This reward however not to be payable any county officer or any person in the employ of the county. 5 00

Upon motion, duly carried, it was ordered that the treasurer be instructed to transfer the sum of \$1,600.00 from the county general fund, to the general salary fund. 5 00

Upon motion the Board adjourned until Nov. 18th, 1912. 5 00
