

NEW FILM COMPANY.

Will Make Specialty of Indian and Mexican Pictures.

Incorporation papers for the organization of the new Tucson film company, announced a few days ago, are now being prepared and the active work of the new company will begin within a short time.

The new company will be known as the Chinese 6 Film Feature company and will be capitalized at \$50,000. The promoter is Robert C. Connell, a former resident of Tucson, and experienced in motion picture work.

The Old Eclair studio, at 430 North Main street, has been leased by the new company. The officers of the new company will be Robert C. Connell, president; F. O. Benedict, vice president; Raymond Oliver, secretary and treasurer. Among the directors and stockholders are J. Knox Corbett and J. B. Ryland.

J. W. Hall, Jr., a local newspaper man, has been chosen for the position of scenario editor. He has accepted the position.

Chinese pictures and melo drama will be made a specialty of but Indian and Mexican films will also be produced. Manager Connell expects to begin work by June 7 and is at present recruiting his company.—Star.

THE LIVESTOCK SITUATION.

A number of California cattle buyers are in the state at the present time, looking for feeder stuff. They are not buying many yearlings, but will take all they can get of two and three year-old steers, old bulls and old cows. They find prices a little high for them and they are not contracting much at asking prices, although some deals have been closed by some of them.

There is still a good demand for cows and heifers, at good prices, but few Arizona range men are selling she stuff this year, and that will be a good thing for the state, for the ranges will carry more stock than is now on them.

In the southern part of the state, from Salt River south, cattle are fat and owners are disposing of their steers and cows to California butchers at 6 cents for steers and 5 cents for cows that are fat enough to kill. In many years range cattle have not been so fat at this time of year and the range men are reaping a deserved harvest.

Sheep are scarce and high. It is almost impossible to buy range sheep at any price, and the owners are all wearing diamonds and store shirts.

Hogs are up again in the price and there is a good demand for all classes at fair prices. Fat, grain finished butcher hogs weighing on average of 175 pounds sold by the Arizona Livestock Commission Co. this week for 7 1/4c, but it would take more money than that to buy them now as that class is very scarce and hard to get.

The dairy cow trade keeps up good, but most of the trading is being done locally between the farmers and dairymen. Prices range from \$65 to \$125 on the average. Holstein and other grades run about the same, but registered stuff runs high.—Stockman-Farmer.

Another Woman Dies From Burns.

Mrs. C. Dusenbury, the wife of a Southern Pacific employee, who was burned by an explosion caused by kerosene at her home early last evening, died this morning at an early hour at a local hospital, where she had been taken following the explosion.

It is said that Mrs. Dusenbury poured oil on a fire in the kitchen stove and it exploded, covering her clothing with the flaming oil. She ran into the yard, where her agonized screams attracted the attention of neighbors, who ran to her assistance and turned a garden hose on her, extinguishing the flames but not before her body had been terribly burned.—Star.
