Board of Supervisors of Santa Cruz County, State of Arizona.

Office of the Board of Supervisors, Santa Cruz County, Nogales, Ariz., July 6th, 1915.

Board met at 9:00 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment of June 8th, 1915.

Present: Chairman Fiedler, Members Parker and Gatlin, and clerk.

Upon motion, board recessed until 1:00 o'clock p. m. and took up work of Board of Equalization.

Board met at 1:00 o'clock p. m. Present: Chairman Fiedler, Members Gatlin and Parker and clerk.

Minutes of meeting of June 7th, and 8th, 1915, read and approved.

Communication from C. O. Foltz with reference to road work at Oro Blanco, was read and placed on file.

Two letters from Robt. A. Rodgers, Forest Ranger, at Canille with reference to repairing county road with funds furnished by the Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, were read and ordered filed.

Communication from State Engineer, giving statement of apportionment of funds for repairing Borderland Highway read and ordered filed.

Communication from T. D. Shaughnessy, Secretary of Arizona State Fair Commission, with reference to appointment of a County Fair Commissioner was read and ordered filed.

Communication from Agricultural Extension Service of Arizona, giving statement of work done by Cochise-Santa Cruz Farm advisor, read and ordered filed.

Communication from Arizona State Tax Commission, to the Board of Supervisors, with invitation for the Board to meet with the Tax Commission, Boards of Supervisors, and Assessors of the Counties of Arizona, at Flagstaff, July 26th, 1915, read and placed on file.

Communication from Arizona State Tax Commission to the Clerk of the Board, giving reference to paragraph 4828 Title XLIX Revised Statutes of Arizona 1913, Civil Code, requiring Clerks to appear at Coconino County Court House, in Flagstaff the week commencing Monday, July 26th, 1915, bringing assessment roll of the county, for the purpose of examining the assessment rolls of the counties, to the end that a better equalization may be had, was read and placed on file.

Office of the Board of Supervisors, Santa Cruz County, Nogales, Ariz., July 8th, 1915.

Board met at 8:00 o'clock a. m., pursuant to recess of July 7th, 1915.

Present: Chairman Fiedler, Members Gatlin and Parker, and Clerk.

Viewer's report of the following described road, was presented and ordered filed:

"Beginning at the N. E. corner of section 6 and running west to the N. W. of section 6, T. 20 S., R. 17E., G. and S. R. Meridian."

Upon motion, and by a unanimous vote of the board, the report was placed on file, as it recommended changes from the original petition.

A petition, signed by the residents and taxpayers of Santa Cruz County, was presented to the board, asking for a change in the county road, described as follows:

(This petition was accompanied by an affidavit of having posted notices of the proposed change for thirty days before presenting petition.)

"Beginning at a point approximately 500 feet west of the east line of Sec. 17 T. 23 S., R. 17 E. G. and S. R. Meridian, at a point 3/8 of a mile south on said east line of said Sec. 17, from the N. E. corner thereof, bearing thence south by approximately 20 degrees west for 1/4 mile, thence for 1/4 mile in a southwest direction on the mesa, intersecting the present Washington road, at a point where it now leaves the mesa for the valley. Again beginning at a point approximately 500 feet east of said intersection of Washington road on the proposed route, running in a westerly direction about 1/4 mile to connect with Mowry Valley Road."

Upon motion, duly carried, said petition was accepted and Mr. Sam Pressler, Chas. Miller and G. N. Bagler were appointed viewers on said road.

A petition signed by residents and tax payers of Santa Cruz county with affidavit of having posted notices thirty days before filing said petition was presented to the board asking for a change in the county road as following:

"Beginning at the northeast corner of Sec. 31, Tp. 20 S., R. 18 E., thence south approximately one and one-half miles to a point on the Canille Elgin Highway."

Upon motion duly carried, said petition was ordered placed on file and action thereon taken under advisement.

A petition signed by residents and tax payers of Santa Cruz county, with affidavit of having posted notices for thirty days prior of filing said petition, was presented to the board, asking the establishment of a public road, the course of which is described as following:

"Beginning at the S. W. corner of Sec. 30, Tp. 20 S. R. 18 E.; thence north on the Tp. line one and one-half miles; thence northerly running along the divide through section 19-18 7 and a part of 6 to a point on the north side of the N. W. 1/4 of N. W. 1/4 Sec. 5, Tp. 20 S., R. 18 E."

Mr. J. L. Adams appeared before the board and filed a protest, signed by residents and tax payers of Santa Cruz county, against the establishment of said road.

Upon motion, said petition was placed on file for further consideration.
