

THE WIDOWS' TAX.

The matter of tax exemption for widows in Arizona appears to be misunderstood or misinterpreted, many believing that the exemptions already passed upon by the state legislature are now in effect, but such is not the case. As the law stands for the presents, widows owning property assessed at \$2000 or over are not allowed an exemption, while if their assessed valuation falls below \$2000 they are entitled to an exemption of \$1000. In this manner, should a widow own property assessed at, say \$1,999, she would pay taxes on the \$999, while if she was assessed \$2000 or more, she would pay taxes on the whole amount.—Exchange.

For His Personal Use.

The Supreme Court of the state will soon decide the question whether a person in Arizona can have spirituous liquors shipped into the state for his personal use under the present prohibition amendment. The case in question is that of the State vs. Lee Stanbury, which was heard before Judge Lockwood this week. Stanbury was found guilty of bringing whiskey into the state, which he claimed was for his personal use, and was sentenced to serve ten days in jail and to pay a fine of \$10. The case was immediately appealed to the higher court.—Benson Signal.

The supreme court has affirmed the death sentences passed by the lower court on William Faltin, John Tomlin and A. M. Leonard, convicted of murder. The three executions are set for November 26. All were sentenced from Maricopa county. Faltin for killing John Peterson, his companion; Tomlin and Leonard, charged with killing the city marshal of Mesa.

The remainder one half of the taxes on all personal property secured by real property and one half of the taxes on all real property will be due and payable on and after the first Monday in March, next, and will be delinquent on the first Monday in May, next, thereafter, at 5 o'clock p. m., unless paid prior thereto, four per cent will be added thereto as penalty, and interest from the time of the delinquency at the rate of ten per cent per annum until paid.

All taxes may be paid at the time the first installment, as herein provided, is due and payable.

The office of the Treasurer and Ex-Officio Tax Collector will be open for the collection of taxes on all days from 9 o'clock a. m. to 12 m., and from 1 o'clock p. m., until 5 o'clock p. m., excepting Sundays and legal holidays.
