MISS LOUISE RONSTADT.

Noted Musical Artist Will be Heard Here Next Thursday Evening.

On Thursday evening, music loving Nogales people will be given a rare treat, at the Lyric Theatre, upon the appearance of Louise Ronstadt a lovely daughter of Tucson, who now resides in San Francisco, where she has attained fame as a musical artist.

In commenting upon the appearance of Miss Ronstadt in Tucson where she will give a recital next Tuesday evening, the Arizona Star of Thursday morning said:

"Miss Louise Ronstadt, of San Francisco, who has already won considerable notice in San Francisco as a singer of unusual attainments, is to be heard in recital here Tuesday evening at the Opera House, under the auspices of the Saturday Morning Musical Club. This is her first appearance in Tucson as a concert singer, her other appearances having been several years ago, before her departure for the coast, and a treat of rare quality is promised to music lovers in Tucson. She is possessed of a superb mezzo soprano voice and remarkable interpretative qualifications, which will result in enjoyment of a high order.

"The appearance of Miss Ronstadt is being looked forward to by Tucsonans with more than interest, owing to the fact that she was raised here and passed her childhood days in this city. Her career, since going to the coast, has been commented upon from time to time. She has met with flattering success in her singing before the Pacific Musical Club, Press Club, and Players' Club of San Francisco, as also the San Francisco Musical Club, and has sung at numerous private affairs given at the St. Francis and Fairmount hotels. A pupil of Esther Mandell, who herself has studied under the famous De Reski, assures one that Miss Ronstadt's musical training has been well carried on.

"That she may come up to the expectations of her friends in Tucson, and those who have so interestedly watched her career, is the paramount idea in Miss Ronstadt's mind over her approaching recital of Tuesday. It has always been her dream to return to Tucson and sing for her home people, and this fact alone should insure her great success, and doubtless an ovation. Her program will include a number of modern French, German, English, and Italian songs, as also a particularly interesting offering, "Atonement," the music for which was written by Miss Maude Luck, formerly of Tucson, and the words by James Warwick, of Los Angeles.

"Miss Ronstadt will be assisted by Mr. Claude Gotthelf, the gifted pianist, who is well known also to Tucsonans. He won considerable fame on the Pacific Coast this past year upon his rendering of the magnificent Cadman "Sonata," at the San Diego Exposition and also before the Bi-ennial Convention of Musical Clubs in Los Angeles."


