file a certified copy of same with the Clerk of Superior Court as provided by law.

A telegram from the Assistant Attorney General, stating that it is the opinion of that department that the Board of Supervisors may issue bonds to fund the indebtedness of scrip now outstanding against Santa Cruz County without an election as this debt creates no new indebtedness and therefore an election would be unnecessary, was read to the Board by the County Attorney.

Upon motion by Chairman Fiedler, seconded by Member Parker and carried unanimously, the clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for sale of fifty-one (51) funding bonds, with accrued interest, of Santa Cruz County, of the denomination of one thousand (\$1,000.) Dollars each, bearing interest payable semi-annually, at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, the principal of said bonds being payable, \$10,000, in ten years after their date of issue, and \$5,000, each year thereafter with the privilege reserved to Santa Cruz County of redeeming all or any portion of said bonds at any time after ten years from their date of issue. The Board of Supervisors reserves the right to reject any and all bids. Bids to be received until 2:30 o'clock p. m., Monday, February 7th, 1916. Bids will be opened and considered by said board at its office, February 7th, 1916, at two thirty o'clock p. m. A certified check for five per cent of the amount bid and copy of the advertisement to accompany each bid.

WHEREAS, Santa Cruz county has, of necessity, issued in payment of its indebtedness, certificates of indebtedness aggregating the sum of Fifty-one thousand (\$51,000) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Board of Supervisors, that it is to the best interests of Santa Cruz county that said indebtedness be funded by the issuance of bonds therefor, as provided in Title 52, Chap. II, of Revised Statutes of Arizona (1913); and

WHEREAS, the amount of said bonds, in the aggregate, will not exceed four per centum of the value of the taxable property of said Santa Cruz County, Arizona;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of Santa Cruz County, Arizona:

That there are hereby directed to be issued negotiable coupon Indebtedness Funding Bonds of Santa Cruz County, Arizona, as provided in said Title 52, Chap. II, of the Revised Statutes of Arizona (1913), in the sum of Fifty-one thousand (\$51,000) Dollars. Said bonds shall consist of Fifty-one (51) bonds, in the sum of One thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, shall be dated February 7th, 1916, and be due and payable as follows, to wit: Ten (10) bonds, making a total sum of Ten thousand (\$10,000) Dollars, at the end of ten years from the date of issuance, and five (5) bonds, making a total of Five thousand (\$5,000) Dollars, each year thereafter, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five (5 per cent) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, as evidenced by the lithographed coupons attached to said bonds, both principal and interest of said bonds payable when due at the office of the County Treasurer of Santa Cruz County, Arizona, in gold coin, lawful money of the United States of America, of the present standard of weight and fineness. Said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Santa Cruz County, Arizona, attested by the clerk of said board under the seal thereof, and countersigned by the treasurer of said county, and registered by said clerk. Said coupons shall be executed by the signature of the chairman of said board, attested by the

clerk, and countersigned by the treasurer of said county; and it is further

ORDERED, that the bonds and coupons shall be substantially in the following form, to wit:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the County of Santa Cruz in the State of Arizona, acknowledges itself to owe and for value received, hereby promises to pay to the bearer.

ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) in lawful money of the United States of America, on the 7th day of February, 19... with interest thereon at the rate of five per centum (5 per cent) per annum from the date hereof, payable semi-annually on the 7th days of February and August in each year, on presentation and surrender of the annexed coupons as they severally become due.

Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at the County Treasurer's office of Santa Cruz County, at Nogales, Arizona.

This bond is one of a series of bonds, fifty-one in number, of One thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, bearing even date herewith, and amounting in the aggregate to Fifty-one thousand (\$51,000.00) Dollars, of Santa Cruz County, Arizona, which the Board of Supervisors of said Santa Cruz County, Arizona, has issued for the purpose of raising money with which to fund the existing outstanding indebtedness of said Santa Cruz county, under and by virtue of and in full and strict compliance with the provisions of Title 52, Chap. II, of the Revised Statutes of Arizona (1913,) and in pursuance of an order of said Board of Supervisors of Santa Cruz County, Arizona, duly and in due time, form and manner adopted and entered upon the minutes of said board prior to the issuance of this bond, and by virtue of the authority vested in said Board of Supervisors, and in pursuance of the provisions of law; and it is hereby certified and receipted that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, have been properly done, happened and performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law; that the money shall be raised by taxation upon the taxable property of said Santa Cruz County, Arizona, for the redemption of this bond and the payment of the interest thereon, and that the total indebtedness of said Santa Cruz County, Arizona, including this bond, exceeds neither the statutory or constitutional limitation of the State of Arizona.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the Board of Supervisors of said Santa Cruz County, Arizona, has caused this bond to be signed by its chairman, attested by its clerk and countersigned by the treasurer, and the seal of the said board hereto affixed, and the annexed interest coupons to be executed with fac-simile signatures of the chairman and clerk of the said board, this 7th day of February, 1916.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that at the time of making the levy of taxes for all county purposes, the Board of Supervisors of Santa Cruz county shall annually levy a tax upon all of the taxable property within the said county, sufficient to pay the interest on the Fifty-one thousand (\$51,000) Dollars Indebtedness Funding Bonds, as it accrues, and shall likewise annually levy a tax upon all the taxable property within the said county, sufficient to provide a sinking fund to retire the bonds at their maturity. All moneys so levied shall be collected and paid into the County Treasury to the credit of the Indebtedness Funding Bond Fund of said county, and be used for no other purpose than herein prescribed.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that said bonds be advertised for sale un-

til February 7th, 1916, in THE BORDER VIDETTE and The Oasis, newspapers of general circulation in Santa Cruz County, Arizona, and the clerk of this board is hereby directed to prepare a notice of advertisement calling for sealed bids for the purchase of said bonds until Monday, February 7th, 1916, said bids to be deposited with the clerk of this board on or before two-thirty o'clock p. m. of said day, said notice to be published once a week for four consecutive weeks before the date of said sale.

The County Treasurer having submitted a report December 31st, 1915, accounting for taxes collected and delinquent in the total sum of the Tax Roll, a second report was submitted accounting for amount of taxes collected and delinquent according to the amount charged against Treasurer at the time the Roll was turned over to him in September, 1915 for collection, which is as follows, to wit:
