FREE ENTERTAINMENT.

"The Message of the Yosemite," at Santa Cruz Club June 6th.

Next Tuesday evening at the Santa Cruz Club, at 8:30, Miss Mildred Leo Clemens, a cousin of the late Samuel Langhorne Clemens (Mark Twain) and a graduate of the University of California, will give a presentation of America's scenic masterpiece, "The Message of the Yosemite."

The entertainment will be given under the joint auspices of the Santa Cruz Club and the Chamber of Commerce for the entertainment of the members of these organizations, and their friends, without charge.

The lecture carries you on a tour of the whole Yosemite Park, 4000 feet of film together with 125 superbly colored stereoscopic views illustrates the lecture.

The motion pictures were taken the past summer, a part of which were secured from the Department of the Interior, the remainder taken by the official photographer for the park and projected the first time last summer before the National Geographic Society and endorsed by the Secretary of the Interior.

BETTER SERVICE PROMISED.

By pre arrangement, Thursday evening, the Directors of the Chamber of Commerce had a conference with R. L. Burgess, District Manager and H. D. McVay, of the Mountain States T. & E. Co. Many complaints of the service rendered by the telephone company in Nogales had been filed with the Chamber and it was with a view of coming to an understanding with the telephone company as to their intentions in regard to improving the service that the conference was brought about.

Mr. McVay was authorized to state that the common battery system, which eliminates the necessity for ringing central, would be installed early in 1917 and stated that the material for this change could not be delivered sooner. The company however at the present time is installing a new section of the switchboard and when this is completed within the next two weeks, a decided improvement for the better would be noted in the service rendered. The gentlemen made no effort to defend the service rendered but blamed the lack of proper equipment rather than the local force. As a result of the conference, an effort will be made to correct many little complaints and to educate the public to assist in making it possible for the operators to render more efficient service.



KELSEY CONTESTS.

H. W. Kelsey, through his attorneys, Frazier & Johns, has filed contest proceedings in the Superior Court, against the election of L. W. Mix, Democrat, and J. W. Edwards, Republican, declared elected town councilmen at the recent town election.

The defendants will have ten days in which to file an answer to the suit. The official election returns showed that Edwards was elected over Kelsey by one vote. Captain Mix's majority over Kelsey was five votes.

The suit will not interfere with the organization of the council next Monday night, at which time the members will select one of the members to act as mayor.

Mr. Kelsey says that he is in the fight to the finish, or until the votes cast at the city election, are recounted.

The official counters will consist of three, one selected by Mr. Kelsey, one by Messrs. Mix and Edwards, and one by the Superior Court.




