TO BE HELDEN IN IRON RIVER AGAIN—BIG PREMIUM LIST.

The second annual exhibition of the Iron County Agricultural Society will be held on the 17th and 18th of September this year, the place of holding the fair has not yet been decided, but will undoubtedly be the same as last year—Iron River, the branch of industry intended to benefit being more extensively carried on there than any other town in the county; though Crystal Falls could take the fair and carry it to success. The exhibition of last year was a decided success in every way and no doubt a greater effort will be made.
