W. C. T. U. COLUMN.

The Chicago Inter-Ocean says that the dining cars upon the Northwestern railroad have conspicuously written across their bill of fare: "No orders from the wine list filled while going through Iowa."

The Lansing Republican says "it is rumored that Merritt Moore of Ionia, chairman of the prohibition State central committee, is in favor of prohibitionists giving their support to the Republican ticket."

The New York State constitutional amendment committee, representing various temperance organizations of the State, calls a State convention at Syracuse, October 4, to take steps to secure submission to the popular vote of a prohibition amendment to the State constitution.

The laws of Michigan provide that: "No person shall be employed as engineer, train-dispatcher, fireman, brakeman, or other servant upon any railroad in any of its operating departments who uses intoxicating drink as a beverage."

Query? Is this law enforced, if not why?

The temperance men and women of Michigan may now rest assured that the amendment will go to the people.

Gov. Jerome places himself squarely on the platform adopted by the late Republican State convention including the question, of the submission of the prohibitory constitutional amendment to a vote of the people.

The Hastings Banner says "the Republican party declare squarely in favor of the submission of a prohibitory amendment—no whiffing and no trifling with the question."

The Frankfort Express, talks as follows about the question of prohibition, as far as it relates to the present political canvass in this State, and we think his views are sensible ones.

Prohibition is to be one of the factors in the Fall election in Michigan. We believe the time is not far distant when the sale of liquor as a beverage will be prohibited in this State by Constitutional amendment. But how is it to be accomplished? Is the prohibition element strong enough to stand and work alone, or must success be looked for by work in the ranks of the Republican and Democratic parties. Cool wise heads and not enthusiasts, temperate temperance men and not rabid fanatics should counsel together, and plan for placing the votes of temperance people where they will do the most good.

We believe the time has not come for an independent temperance movement. This love of party is too strong for such a move. There are many good temperance men who are very anxious to do all they can to suppress intemperance who would not forsake their party and enlist under a prohibition banner, because temperance is not the only issue before the people. They honestly believe the life of their party as much consequence as a distinctively prohibition party, such men will work for temperance in the ranks of the party of their choice, but will join no movement which they believe would lead to the death of such party. The temperance people of Iowa achieved success by working in the ranks of the Republican and Democratic parties and the prohibition amendment in that State was voted for by the people without reference to any political party. The place to work is in the primaries and if temperance sentiments can control nominating caucuses and conventions the work is done so far as a prohibitory amendment is concerned, and then will come the tug of war.
