RESOLVED: By the Common Council of the City of Owosso that it is hereby deemed a necessary public improvement, that Martin street, in said city be widened from the D. G. H. & M. R. R. south to Stewart street and that a strip of land 5 feet and 3 inches wide be taken along each side of said Martin street and added to said Martin street, making said st. 49 1/2 feet wide and that said Common Council intend to take the same for that purpose and that said Common Council intend to take the same for that purpose and that said Common Council will on the 10th day of June, A. D. 1887, apply to the Justice Court of Benjamin F. 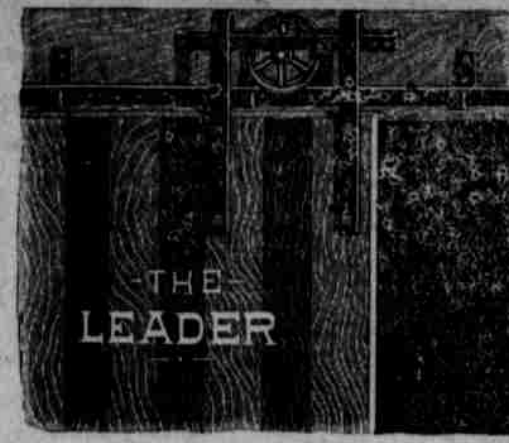
